- WHEREAS, it is the Legislature's responsibility to provide for the educational instruction

- WHEREAS, the Legislature sanctions the development of interscholastic opportunities for

- between academic achievement and interscholastic activities, must be considered to discern if

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eightieth

- 1 Board of the Legislative Research Council be requested to appoint an interim committee to
- 2 study the control, supervision, and regulation of high school interscholastic activities. The
- 3 interim committee should study the constitution, by-laws, rules, and operation of any
- 4 interscholastic association created pursuant to chapter 13-36. The interim committee should
- 5 prepare a report detailing its findings and recommendations, include any proposals for
- 6 legislation that it may deem advisable, and submit the report to the Executive Board of the
- 7 Legislative Research Council no later than December 1, 2005.
