## HOUSE BILL NO. 1056

Introduced by: The Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the Board of Counselor Examiners

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions relating to the practice of 2 counseling. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 4 Section 1. That § 36-32-1 be amended to read as follows: 5 36-32-1. Terms as used in this chapter mean: (1) "Board," the Board of Counselor Examiners established under this chapter; 7 (2) "Counseling," rendering or offering to render to any person, group, organization, or the general public, a counseling service involving the application of clinical 8 9 counseling principles, methods, or procedures to assist any person in achieving more 10 effective personal, social, educational, or career development and adjustment; 11 "Counseling principles, methods, or procedures," an approach to counseling that 12 emphasizes the counselor's role in systematically assisting any client through all of 13 the following: assessing and analyzing background and current information, 14 formulating a conceptual understanding of the problem, exploring possible solutions, 15 and developing and providing a treatment plan for mental and emotional adjustment

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1		or development "Counseling treatment interventions," the application of cognitive,
2		affective, behavioral, and systemic counseling strategies which include principles of
3		development, wellness, and pathology implemented in the context of a professional
4		counseling relationship;
5	<del>(4)</del> (3)	"Doctorate or master's degree in counseling," completion of study following a
6		bachelor's degree in a clearly identified counseling program which stands as a
7		recognizable organizational entity within an accredited institution of higher learning
8		and which includes participation in a supervised practicum and internship in
9		counseling;
10	<del>(5)</del> (4)	"Postgraduate," following completion of study for a master's or doctoral degree;
11	<u>(5)</u>	"Practice of professional counseling," application of mental health, psychological,
12		and human development principles in order to:
13		(a) Facilitate human development and adjustment throughout the life span;
14		(b) Prevent, diagnose, and treat mental, emotional, or behavioral disorders and
15		associated distresses which interfere with mental health;
16		(c) Conduct assessments and diagnoses for the purpose of establishing treatment
17		goals and objectives; and
18		(d) Plan, implement, and evaluate treatment plans using counseling treatment
19		interventions;
20	(6)	"Supervised internship," an actual on-the-job-experience in professional counseling
21		under the supervision of an on-site supervisor who is a licensed professional
22		counselor or related mental health professional or who is eligible to be licensed;
23	(7)	"Supervised practicum," the providing of counseling to any bona fide client or group
24		seeking services from a counselor. This supervised practicum shall be under the

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direction of a qualified graduate faculty member and includes critiquing of counseling, either observed or recorded on audio or video tape.

Section 2. That § 36-32-9 be amended to read as follows:

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- 36-32-9. It is a Class 2 misdemeanor for any person to engage in the practice, or attempt to practice, counseling as a licensed professional counselor without a license, or licensed professional counselor-mental health without a certificate, professional counseling as defined in subdivision 36-32-1(5) and collect a fee for the service without a license issued pursuant to this chapter.
- 9 Section 3. That § 36-32-12 be amended to read as follows:
- 36-32-12. Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prevent anyone from doing work
  within the standards and ethics of the person's respective profession or calling, provided the
  person does not hold himself or herself out to the public as a counselor by using the title
  "licensed professional counselor," "licensed counselor" or "licensed professional counselormental health" unless the person is licensed or certified under this chapter. This chapter does
  not apply to the activities and services of a person practicing professional counseling as defined
  in subdivision 36-32-1(5) as part of that person's duties as a:
  - (1) Professional licensed or certified under this title acting in a manner consistent with state law regarding the scope of practice;
- 19 (2) Person employed by a school, college, university, or other institution of higher
  20 learning;
- 21 (3) Person employed by a federal, state, county, or local governmental institution or
  22 agency while performing those duties for which the person was employed by such
  23 institution, agency, or facility;
- 24 (4) Person who is employed by a licensed health care facility, an accredited prevention

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1		or treatment facility, an adjustment training center, a nonprofit mental health center,
2		or a licensed or registered child welfare agency;
3	<u>(5)</u>	Member of the clergy while acting in a ministerial capacity if the activity is within
4		the scope of performance of regular or specialized duties;
5	<u>(6)</u>	Post-graduate supervised trainee who has an approved plan of supervision on file
6		with the board;
7	<u>(7)</u>	Mental health practitioner who has a minimum of a master's degree in counseling or
8		a related mental health field with a plan of supervision and original transcripts on file
9		with the board before July 1, 2008; or
10	<u>(8)</u>	Students enrolled in recognized programs of study leading to counseling degrees
11		may practice only under the direct supervision of a counselor educator or counselor
12		licensed under this chapter.
13	Section	on 4. That chapter 36-32 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
14	follows:	
15	The r	equirements of subdivisions 36-32-13(5), (6) and (7) are waived if the applicant:
16	(1)	Has a master's degree in counseling or a related mental health field;
17	(2)	Has completed an application for licensure before January 1, 2008; and
18	(3)	Submits three letters of verification on forms provided by the board documenting a
19		minimum of ten years of at least half-time professional counseling as defined in
20		subdivision 36-32-1(5) in the immediate preceding fifteen years.
