- The Department is responsible for the promotion and enhancement of South Dakota agriculture, and for the implementation of a variety of state laws relating to agriculture.










SDDA Full-Time Staff - 109











- 6% decrease in state noxious weeds
- 5% decrease in all noxious weeds despite adding two new weeds to the list.
- 1 million + bio-control agents given to private landowners
- Currently testing different bio-control agent.



Agricultural Services Noxious Weeds





- SDDA/University of Idaho-Bio Control Parasite Study
- \$450,000 in grant funds to the counties and others for control of noxious weeds and pests
 - FY14 plan to increase to \$650,000



Great Success!


- 2012 Attendance: 192,790, up 1% over 2011

- The number of campers on the grounds grew to 1,744 this year, up 8% over last year.




State Fair: Trends of Success

State Fair Park: Trends of Success





Wildland Fire Division-2012





- 1,350 fires on federal lands
- 1,213 fires on state and private lands
- 500 acres of hazardous fuels treated on 125 projects
- Burned 850 piles or 21 acres of prescribed burning.
- 54 training classes with a total of 966 students
- Helped out other states in their time of need by sending resources.

SD Department of Agriculture Agency Sponsored Legislation



- HB1049 transfers the value added agriculture subfund from the Governor's Office of Economic Development to the Department of Agriculture.
- HB1050 makes an appropriation for the suppression of mountain pine beetles, to establish a cost share program with the counties in the state.
- HB1057 makes an appropriation for the costs related to the suppression of wildfires in the state.



- SB17 makes an appropriation of other fund expenditure authority to the coordinated natural resources conservation fund for state conservation grants.
- SB18 authorizes the reconstruction of a 4-H exhibit hall facility on the State Fair grounds and appropriates \$4m of other fund expenditure authority.



- SB19 authorizes the construction of an inmate housing unit on the State Fair grounds and appropriates \$100,000 of other fund expenditure authority.
- SB22 appropriates \$500,000 of general funds and \$300,000 of federal fund expenditure authority for construction and renovations at the Department's Rapid City Office facility.
