- <u>HB 1279</u>* (Deferred from 31st LD) align math and science education with South Dakota's historic and unique scientific opportunities, to direct the Department of Education to initiate Project Lead the Way, to develop a clearinghouse for certain educational opportunities, and to provide for an independent analysis of the state's content standards, and to make an appropriation therefor, and to require the Department of Education to develop a framework for a high school for the twenty-first century, and to require high schools to report on activities and results relative to that framework. (Deferred from 31st LD) revise the funding for K-12 education.
- HB 1300* (Deferred from 31st LD) require the Department of Education to develop a framework for a high school for the twenty-first century, and to require high schools to report on activities and results relative to that framework.

- <u>HB 1087</u>* (Deferred from 31st LD) revise the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2008 regarding appropriations to the Department of Executive Management, the Department of Revenue and Regulation, the Department of Game, Fish and Parks, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Education, the Board of Regents, the Department of Human Services, and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

<u>HB 1085</u>* (Deferred from 31st LD) authorize the South Dakota Building Authority to provide for the construction, reconstruction, renovation, and modernization of science facilities and laboratories at public universities and to make an appropriation therefor.
<u>HB 1069</u> (Deferred from 31st LD) make an appropriation to the coordinated natural resources

conservation fund and to declare an emergency.

<u>HB 1047</u>* (Deferred from 31st LD) make an appropriation to assist sparse school districts.
