WHEREAS, Nash Hutmacher is a four-star recruit as offensive tackle, the second highest star ranking possible, one that only a handful of talented athletes achieve, and his success in the sport of football has attracted multiple offers to continue his athletics at multiple Division I schools; and

- WHEREAS, Nash Hutmacher's dedication and hard work in the sport of football and wrestling is incredible as well as his athleticism in both sports:
