

2021 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1005

Introduced by: The Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners

1An Act to repeal the emergency medical technician-student status license2requirement.

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **Section 1.** That § 36-4B-1 be AMENDED.

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36-4B-1. Definition of terms.

- Terms used in this chapter mean:
- 7 (1) "Advanced life support," a level of prehospital and interhospital emergency care
 8 consisting of basic life support procedures and definitive therapy including the use
 9 of invasive procedures and may include the use of drugs and manual defibrillation;
- 10 (2) "Advanced life support personnel," any person other than a physician who has 11 completed a department and board approved program and is licensed as an 12 emergency medical technician-intermediate/85; emergency medical technician-13 intermediate/99; emergency medical technician-advanced; or emergency medical 14 technician-paramedic as set forth in this chapter, or its equivalent;
- 15 (3) "Board," the South Dakota Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners;
- 16 (4) "Department," the South Dakota State Department of Health;
- 17 (5) "Direct medical control," communications between field personnel and a physician
 18 during an emergency run;
- (6) "Emergency medical services," health care provided to the patient at the scene,
 during transportation to a medical facility, between medical facilities and upon entry
 at the medical facility;
- (7) "Emergency medical technician-advanced," any person who has successfully
 completed a program of study approved by the department and the board in all
 areas of training and skills set forth in the advanced emergency medical technician
 instructional guidelines and standards, including placement of esophageal and
 supraglottic airways, intravenous cannulation, shock management, administration

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of specific medications, and other advanced skills approved by the board, and who
 is licensed by the board to perform such advanced skills;

- 3 (8) "Emergency medical technician/EMT," any person trained in emergency medical
 4 care in accordance with standards prescribed by rules and regulations promulgated
 5 pursuant to § 34-11-6, who provides emergency medical services, including
 6 automated external defibrillation under indirect medical control, in accordance with
 7 the person's level of training;
- 8 (9) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate/85," any person who has successfully 9 completed a department and board approved program of instruction in basic life 10 support and advanced life support skills in shock and fluid therapy, placement of 11 esophageal airways, and other advanced life support skills approved by board 12 action, and who is licensed by the board to perform such skills, including automated 13 external defibrillation;
- (10) "Emergency medical technician-paramedic," any person who has successfully
 completed a program of study approved by the department and the board and is
 licensed as an emergency medical technician-paramedic, which includes all training
 and skills set forth herein for emergency medical technician-intermediate/85 and
 emergency medical technician-intermediate/99, and other advanced skills
 programs approved by board action, and who is licensed by the board to perform
 such intermediate, special, and advanced skills;
- 21 (11) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate/99," any person who has successfully 22 completed a department and board approved program of instruction in all areas of 23 emergency medical technician-intermediate/85 curriculum plus other specific areas 24 of emergency medical care in the following areas: manual and automated external 25 defibrillation, telemetered electrocardiography, administration of cardiac drugs, 26 administration of specific medications and solutions, use of adjunctive breathing 27 devices, advanced trauma care, tracheotomy suction, esophageal airways and 28 endotracheal intubation, intraosseous infusion, or other special skills programs 29 approved by board action, and who is licensed by the board to perform intermediate 30 skills plus such special skills;
- (12) "Emergency medical technician-student status," any person who has received
 authorization for student status by the board and who has been accepted into an
 advanced life support training program to perform, under direct supervision, those
 activities and services currently being studied;

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- (13) "Epinephrine auto-injector," a spring-loaded needle and syringe with a single dose 1 2 of epinephrine that will automatically release and inject the medicine, any similar 3 automatic pre-filled cartridge injector, or any similar automatic injectable 4 equipment; 5 (14)(13) "Good faith," honesty, in fact, in the conduct, or transaction concerned; (15)<u>(14)</u> 6 "Gross negligence," the intentional failure to perform a manifest duty in 7 reckless disregard of the consequences as affecting the life or health of another; 8 (16)(15)"Hour of advanced life support studies," fifty minutes of training; 9 "Indirect medical control," the establishment and implementation of system (17)(16)policies and procedures, such as medical treatment protocols, quality assurance 10 programs and case reviews by a physician licensed in South Dakota; 11 12 "Local government," any county, municipality, township, or village in this (18)(17) 13 state; 14 (19)(18) "Medical community," the physicians and medical resources located and 15 available within a geographic area; 16 "Medical emergency," an event affecting an individual in such a manner that (20)(19) 17 a need for immediate medical care is created; "Patient," an individual who, as a result of illness or injury needs immediate 18 (21)(20)19 medical attention, whose physical or mental condition is such that the individual is 20 in imminent danger of loss of life or significant health impairment, or who may be 21 otherwise incapacitated or helpless as a result of a physical or mental condition; 22 and 23 (22)(21)"Prehospital care," those emergency medical services rendered to emergency 24 patients in an out-of-hospital setting, administered for analytic, stabilizing, or 25 preventive purposes, precedent to and during transportation of such patients to 26 emergency treatment facilities. 27 Section 2. That § 36-4B-4 be REPEALED. 28 36-4B-4. Authorized activities of advanced life support students--29 Supervision. 30 Section 3. That § 36-4B-6 be REPEALED. 36-4B-6. Grant of student status--Qualifications of applicants. 31 32 Section 4. That § 36-4B-7 be AMENDED.

1	3	6-4B-7. RequirementsEducational programs in advanced life support.
2		An educational program for instruction of advanced life support personnel shall
3	meet the following general requirements:	
4	(1)	The educational program shall develop an evaluation mechanism satisfactory to the
5		Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners to determine the effectiveness of its
6		theoretical and clinical programs, the results of which shall be made available to
7		the board annually;
8	(2)	Instructors in the theoretical and clinical training programs shall be competent and
9		properly qualified in their respective fields of instruction and clinical training;
10	(3)	The educational program shall establish a method of definitive candidate selection
11		satisfactory to the board , in addition to requirements set forth by § 36-4B-6; and
12	(4)	The number of students enrolled in the theoretical program may not exceed the
13		number that can be clinically supervised and trained.
