1 JOINT SESSION

They said to him, "You are old, and your sons do not follow your ways; now appoint a king to lead us, such as all the other nations have." But when they said, "Give us a king to lead us," this displeased Samuel; so, he prayed to the Lord. And the Lord told him: "Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king. As they have done from the day I brought them up out of Egypt until this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so they are doing to you. Reconcile us, Oh Lord-Forgive us, Oh God-Remind us of what we have been called and elected to do in a Christian, Faithful manner which requires humility, community, and dignity in this space, and in our home communities—in the best of times—but most importantly in the worst of times—times much like we are living in right now. I pray that we have not rejected you. I pray that we have learned from our Israelite ancestors—we do not need a King or Idol-WE NEED YOU AND YOU ALONE. I pray that we will cling to Your hope, Your will, Your promises, and Your desires for the people of this great state in the weeks and months ahead, so help us God. Amen.
