HB 1068: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise the requirement for written findings of fact and conclusions in certain judicial proceedings involving a child.

HB 1069: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to modify the expenditures that are recoverable as disbursements by a prevailing party in a civil action or a special proceeding.

Introduced by: The Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Chief Justice

HB 1070: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the Unified Judicial System.

Introduced by: The Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Chief Justice

HB 1071: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to correct incorrect cross-references dealing with crimes and criminal procedures and repeal an obsolete section.

Introduced by: The Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Office of the Governor
