The court shall treat individually identifying information including the gender, age, ethnicity, race, national origin, location, or identity of any person subject to the proceedings as strictly confidential information. If necessary, identifying numbers or initials may be used to protect the individually identifying information of the person.

## 34-22-18.1. [Effective July 1, 2021] Action for injunction to enforce department directive or order--Confidential information.
