The licensee may only offer as samples the malt beverages, wine, <u>cider</u>, distilled spirits, liqueurs, and cordials that the licensee currently has in stock and is offering for sale to the general public. The malt beverage, wine, <u>cider</u>, distilled spirits, liqueur, and cordial samples shall be dispensed at no charge and shall be consumed on the licensed premises during the permitted hours of off-sale. No sample of malt beverage <u>or cider</u> may be larger than three fluid ounces. No sample of wine may be larger than fifty milliliters and no sample of distilled spirits, liqueur, or cordial may be larger than twenty-five milliliters. A violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor."
