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Article I: Acts Causing the Death of Joseph Boever

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Article XVI, § 3 of the South Dakota Constitution provides that the House of Representatives may impeach "state and judicial officers," for "drunkenness, crimes, corrupt conduct, or malfeasance or misdemeanors in office. " Jason Ravensborg committed crimes or misdemeanors in office causing the death of Joseph Boever, specifically:

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(1) On the evening of September 12, 2020, Jason Ravensborg failed to operate his vehicle within its proper lane, crossed outside such lane, and struck pedestrian and Highmore, South Dakota resident Joseph Boever. Mr. Boever died from injuries sustained from the collision; and

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(2) Jason Ravensborg has been charged by the Hyde County State's Attorney with three separate crimes in connection with his driving on the night in question.

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The Attorney General having a special obligation to the People and the Laws of the State of South Dakota, Jason Ravensborg must be removed from such office for his crimes or misdemeanors in office causing the death of Joseph Boever.

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Article II: Other Acts Following the Death of Joseph Boever

1 Article XVI, § 3 of the South Dakota Constitution provides that the House of Representatives
 2 may impeach "state and judicial officers," for "drunkenness, crimes, corrupt conduct, or malfeasance
 3 or misdemeanors in office. " Jason Ravnsborg committed crimes or misdemeanors in office
 4 associated with the investigation following the death of Joseph Boever.

5 Following the collision, including during his reporting of the collision and the resulting
 6 investigation, Jason Ravnsborg undertook actions unbecoming the Attorney General. Jason
 7 Ravnsborg's statements and actions failed to meet the standard of the Office of the Attorney
 8 General.

9 The Attorney General having a special obligation to the People and the Laws of the State of
 10 South Dakota, Jason Ravnsborg must be removed from such office for his crimes or misdemeanors
 11 in office following the death of Joseph Boever" and insert " after a conviction, plea of guilty or nolo
 12 contendere, or acquittal in case number 34MAG21-0001, State v. Jason Ravnsborg, the House of
 13 Representatives may evaluate whether articles of impeachment against Jason Ravnsborg, Attorney
 14 General of the State of South Dakota, are necessary and proceed accordingly"
