- (2) The person was in possession of no more than three ounces of cannabis, the amount of cannabis products allowed by department rules, six cannabis plants minimum or as prescribed by a physician, and the cannabis produced by those plants;:

(a) Three ounces of cannabis;

- (b) A quantity of cannabis products containing no more than twenty-four grams of cannabis
 concentrate or a greater amount if allowed by department rules;
- 31 (c) Six cannabis plants kept in or on the grounds of a single residence at one time and any 32 cannabis produced by those six plants provided that the cannabis is located at the same property 33 where the plants were cultivated; or

(d) Any combination of subsections (a), (b), or (c);

- (3) The person was engaged in the acquisition, possession, use, manufacture, cultivation, or transportation of cannabis, paraphernalia, or both, relating to the administration of cannabis to treat or alleviate the person's debilitating medical condition or symptoms associated with the person's debilitating medical condition; and
- 39 (4) Any cultivation of cannabis and storage of more than three ounces of cannabis 40 occurred in a secure location that only the person asserting the defense could access.
