



Select Comparison of Adult-Use Taxes



| State | Tax Type | | |
|------------|--|--|--|
| Alaska | Weight-based Excise Tax: \$50 per ounce for flowers/mature buds. \$25 per ounce for immature or abnormal buds \$15 per ounce for trim Clones: flat rate of \$1 per clone | | |
| California | 15% excise tax on retail sales 7.25% state sales tax Cultivation tax: \$9.25 per ounce for flowers; \$2.75 per ounce for leaves; \$1.29 per ounce of fresh plant. | | |
| Colorado | 15% excise tax 15% retail sales tax | | |
| Illinois | Cultivation privilege tax: 7% of the gross receipts from the sale of cannabis by a cultivator or craft grower to a dispensing organization Cannabis Purchaser Excise Tax: 10% of purchase price – cannabis with THC level at or below 35% 20% of purchase price – all cannabis infused products 25% of the purchase price – cannabis with THC level above 35% 6.25% state sales and use tax | | |
| Montana | 20% excise tax at retail | | |

Medical Cannabis Taxes

Of the 37 states that have comprehensive medical cannabis programs:

- 11 states exempt medical cannabis from sales and/or excise taxes
- 10 states apply sales and use taxes
- 8 states apply a special excise tax
- 6 states apply both an excise tax and sales taxes









| State | FY 2018 | FY 2019 | FY 2020 |
|-------------|---------|---------|-----------|
| Alaska | \$11.1 | \$19.2 | \$24.5 |
| California* | \$397.3 | \$636.9 | \$1,031.9 |
| Colorado* | \$266.5 | \$302.5 | \$375.9 |
| Nevada | \$69.8 | \$99.2 | \$105.2 |
| Oregon | \$82.2 | \$102.1 | \$133.2 |
| Washington | \$362.0 | \$390.4 | \$469.2 |

Forecasting Challenges

- Difficult to estimate both demand and market prices, especially for early-adopting states
- Legal market takes time to develop
- Strong, early revenue growth tends to slow

Typical Costs to the State

- Licensing, Permitting, Monitoring and Inspection
- Tax Administration
- Law Enforcement
- Fewer Court Fees and Penalties









Impact of Future Federal Action

- Marijuana is still classified as an illegal, schedule one controlled substance.
- Cannabis prices could fall if federal barriers to doing business are removed.
