BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the ninth day of November, A.D., two thousand twenty one, at the hour of ten o'clock meridian, being the day and hour named by the presiding officers of both houses of the Legislature, for the convening of the Legislature in the Second Special Session, the House of Representatives in the Capitol, in the city of Pierre, in the county of Hughes, and the state of South Dakota, the seat of government thereof, was called to order by Speaker Spencer Gosch.

The following prayer was offered by Pastor Craig Wexler, Pierre/Fort Pierre Ministerial Association, Pierre, South Dakota:

As the Prophet, Amos, says in the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter, "...Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." We are called here today to discern our work—our prayers—our role in how we walk alongside the struggles of humanity. Your justice will always reign true no matter our words—no matter our thoughts—no matter our actions. But we also know that each one of us is called into our elected roles in this moment in time. Your Joint-Select Committee appointed on joint rules respectfully reports that it has had under consideration the joint rules and recommends that the joint rules of the Ninety-sixth Legislative Session be adopted with the following exceptions:

Whereas Article III, Section 31 of the South Dakota Constitution empowers the Legislature to call itself into special session and the Legislature having issued a proclamation calling a special session for the purpose of investigating and evaluating whether the conduct of Jason Ravnsborg, Attorney General of the State of South Dakota, surrounding the death of Joe Boever, involved impeachable offenses, Article XVI, Section 3 of the South Dakota Constitution, and if so to conduct

1 further impeachment proceedings there on and legislate on matters involving the attorney general's  
2 office; and

3           Whereas Article III, Section 9 of the South Dakota Constitution provides that the Legislature  
4 shall determine the rules of its proceedings, your Joint-Select Committee appointed for the purpose  
5 of preparing rules for the second Special Session respectfully reports that the rules of the regular  
6 session of the Ninety-sixth Legislative Session be made the rules of the Senate and House during  
7 the second Special Session with the following exceptions and that such printing of the rules in the  
8 journal be dispensed with:

9           Special Rule No. 1: Notwithstanding any other rule, the presiding officer may dispense with  
10 the referral of a bill or resolution to a standing committee.

11           Special Rule No. 2: None of the deadlines in regard to bill or resolution introduction and  
12 hearing shall apply to the Special Session. Any legislator may introduce, at any time during this  
13 Special Session, any bill or resolution germane to the proclamation.

14           Special Rule No. 3: The presiding officers of the House and the Senate may appoint the  
15 officers and employees for the respective bodies as they deem necessary to carry out the activities  
16 of the respective houses.

17           Special Rule No. 4: No rules dealing with a call of the house shall apply to the Special  
18 Session, except that the attendance of any member who has answered the initial roll call each day  
19 may be compelled by the presiding officer.

20           Special Rule No. 5: No rules, including, but not limited to, Joint Rules 5-17 and 7-7, dealing  
21 with required delivery of bills and placement of bills or resolutions on the calendar, shall apply to  
22 the Special Session; and the placement of bills or resolutions on the calendar for second reading  
23 shall be determined by a majority vote of the members-elect.

24           Special Rule No. 6: Rules dealing with the order of business shall prevail, provided, however,  
25 that the order of business may be changed by a majority vote of the members-elect, thereby  
26 bringing up any item of action by such vote. The proclamation calling the Legislature into Special  
27 Session shall govern the consideration of all bills and resolutions and the body shall determine the  
28 germaneness of a given bill and resolution to the proclamation.

29           Special Rule No. 7: Rules dealing with fiscal notes shall not apply to the Special Session.

30           Special Rule No. 8: The whole body of either house or of both houses may, upon appropriate  
31 motion or motions, convene as a committee of the whole for the sole purpose of taking testimony  
32 and allowing the questioning of witnesses, regarding any bill or resolution that has been introduced  
33 in either chamber within the scope of these rules and the proclamation convening this special  
34 session. Joint Rule 9-1, pertaining to the designation of a chair of a committee of the whole, does  
35 not apply. The President pro tempore may preside over any committee of the whole of the Senate.  
36 The Speaker of the House may preside over any committee of the whole of the House.

37           Special Rule No. 9: Joint Rules 2-1 and 2-4, relating to access to the floor of each chamber,  
38 do not apply to any individual entering the floor of the House or Senate for the sole purpose of  
39 providing testimony to, or answering the questions of, a committee of the whole of either house or  
40 of both houses.

41           Special Rule No. 10: No rules dealing with the printing and distribution of bills or resolutions  
42 shall apply to the Special Session, and the Legislative Research Council and Secretary of State shall  
43 provide photocopies of bills introduced to the public and legislative agents.

44           Special Rule No. 11: At the conclusion of the second Special Session, the Chief Clerk of the  
45 House and the Secretary of the Senate shall review the journal prepared and make the necessary

1 corrections and provide the contract printer with the corrected journal for distribution to those who  
2 subscribed to journals during the regular Ninety-sixth Legislative Session.

3 Special Rule No. 12: Notwithstanding Joint Rule 11-1, House Rule H4-1, and Senate Rule  
4 S5-1, a majority of the members-elect of either house may suspend, adopt, or amend any of the  
5 rules.
