- Environmental Funding Projects (Local): \$600 Million
- Environmental Funding Projects (State): \$60 Million
- Workforce Housing Sewer and Stormwater:
 \$50 Million



Local Water and Wastewater Funding: \$600 million

- Provide quality drinking water and necessary sewer services
- Health and welfare
- Protects the environment and our Natural Resources
- Economic driver for our economy
- Only state political subdivisions and private non-profits who provide water and sewer services apply for funding thru DANR and the Board of Water and Natural Resources



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


State Water Plan Process

- Applications for new projects were due on October 31st.
- Application overload
- November 4th Board of Water and Natural Resources Meeting
- Current State Water Plan:
 - Nearly 250 eligible projects
 - Over \$3.2 billion in project funding request
 - Projects range from municipality, sanitation districts, and rural water systems.



Total Funding Requests



Proposed Allocation

- 1: Local ARPA matched by State ARPA 50/50
- 2: Flat 30% of eligible project cost, capped.
 - Less than 1,000 service pop.: 80% grant up to \$9K per person
 - Less than 2,500 service pop.: 50% grant up to \$5k per person
 - Above 2,500 service pop.: 30% grant up to \$3K per person
- 3. User Rate Goals: Eligible applicants
 - Municipal Wastewater: \$50 \$55
 - Municipal Water: \$50 \$55
 - Rural Water/Others: \$75
- 4. Discretionary for regionalization/consolidation, regulatory compliance issues, drought resiliency/drinking water availability, and non-point source improvements
- 5. Request for engineering studies to address long-term drought resiliency and water source issues for drinking water and regionalization of wastewater treatment: up to 100%




State Owned Facilities: \$60 Million

- Many state agencies with eligible water and sewer infrastructure in need of improvements
- Agencies are developing list of needs for funding consideration in coordination with DANR review for eligibility
- If ARP funds are provided this will reduce the need for Maintenance & Repair funds for these utilities and allow other necessary improvements to be funded instead
- Would have long term positive impact on state owned facilities



State Agency ARPA Funding Requests Water and Sewer Infrastructure Total \$60 Million





Workforce Housing Funding: \$50 million for wastewater and stormwater

- DANR ensure all project cost are eligible
 - Project must be done by a state political subdivisions and private non-profits
- GOED: Administer Program
- The Board of Economic Development will award the grants to projects.
