3	BE IT E	NACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
4	Section	1. That § 10-12-42 be AMENDED:
5 6	tho a	10-12-42. For taxes payable in 20222023 and each year thereafter, the levy for eneral fund of a school district-shall be is as follows:
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7	(1)	The maximum tax levy-shall be is six dollars and fifty-twothirty-seven and five-
8		tenthsfour-tenths cents per thousand dollars of taxable valuation, subject to the
9		limitations on agricultural property as provided in subdivision (2) of this section
10		and owner-occupied property as provided in subdivision (3) of this section;
11	(2)	The maximum tax levy on agricultural property for the school district shall be is one
12		dollar and fortythirty-seven and nine-tenthssix-tenths cents per thousand dollars
13		of taxable valuation. If the district's levies are less than the maximum levies as
14		stated in this section, the levies shall maintain the same proportion to each other
15		as represented in the mathematical relationship at the maximum levies; and
16	(3)	The maximum tax levy for an owner-occupied single-family dwelling as defined in
17		§ 10-13-40 for the school district-shall be is three dollars and fifteen and three-
18		tenthseight cents per thousand dollars of taxable valuation. If the district's levies
19		are less than the maximum levies as stated in this section, the levies shall maintain
20		the same proportion to each other as represented in the mathematical relationship
21		at the maximum levies.
22		All levies in this section-shall must be imposed on valuations where the median
23	level of assessment represents eighty-five percent of market value, as determined by the	
24	Department of Revenue. These valuations <u>shall must</u> be used for all school funding	
25	purposes. If the district has imposed an excess levy pursuant to § 10-12-43, the levies	

26 shall <u>must</u> maintain the same proportion to each other as represented in the mathematical
