14 On page 3, after line 2, of the Introduced bill, insert: "

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated from federal funds deposited in the state drinking water revolving fund subfund established pursuant to § 46A-1-60.1, the sum of \$1,500,000 to the Board of Water and Natural Resources for the purpose of contracting for a lead service line inventory for all public water systems under the state drinking water revolving fund program established pursuant to § 46A-1-60.1. Funds must be provided according to terms and conditions established by the Board of Water and Natural Resources."

And that as so amended said bill be referred to the Joint Committee on Appropriations with a Do Pass recommendation.

The Senate Committee on Legislative Procedure respectfully reports that it has had under consideration the Senate rules and recommends that the Senate rules of the Ninety-sixth Legislative Session be adopted as the Senate rules of the Ninety-seventh Legislative Session with the following changes:

38 Amend Chapter 2 of the Senate rules as follows:

39 2-6. COVID-19 restrictions in Senate areas. Each member of the Senate is expected to
40 wear a mask while on the Senate floor. Any member of the Senate not wearing a mask shall, as

much as practical, remain at least six feet distance from any legislative staff. Any person not a

2 member of the Senate shall wear a mask while on the Senate floor, in a Senate lobby, in the Senate 3 gallery, or in any area adjacent to the rotunda and the Senate on the third or fourth floor of the 4

Capitol. Signs shall be posted to notify persons of these restrictions.

Amend Chapter 4 of the Senate rules as follows:

6 4-4. COVID-19 restrictions in committee. Each member of the Senate is expected to wear 7 a mask while attending a Senate committee. Any member of the Senate not wearing a mask shall, 8 as much as practical, remain at least six feet distance from any legislative staff. Any person not a 9 member of the Senate shall wear a mask while attending a Senate committee meeting. The 10 committee chair may allow a person to remove his or her mask when speaking to the committee. 11 Signs shall be posted to notify persons of these restrictions.

15 The Joint Committee on Legislative Procedure respectfully reports that it has had under 16 consideration the joint rules and recommends that the joint rules of the Ninety-sixth Legislative 17 Session be adopted as the joint rules of the Ninety-seventh Legislative Session with the following 18 changes: 19

Amend Chapter 6A of the joint rules as follows:

20 6A-1. Legislative Documents. Only bills and the following may be introduced in the 21 Legislature:

(1) A House or Senate resolution pertains to the affairs of one house only and requires action 22 23 only by the legislative chamber concerned. A House or Senate resolution may be used to express 24 an opinion or principle of one house, to express an opinion to or make a request of the other house, 25 to regulate procedure, or to refer a topic to the Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council 26 for possible study by an interim study committee;

27 (2) A concurrent resolution does not have the force of law. A concurrent resolution shall only 28 be used to express an opinion or principle of the Legislature, to authorize interim studies, sessions 29 or committees, to instruct a department of state government, or to petition federal agencies;

30 (3) A joint resolution contains matters of legislation only. A joint resolution may be used to 31 refer a matter for referendum to the people, to place a constitutional amendment on the ballot at 32 the next general election, to ratify proposed amendments to the United States Constitution, to enact 33 legislative reapportionment, or to grant a water right pursuant to § 46-5-20.1;

34 (4) A House or Senate resolution of disapproval as provided under Article IV, Section 8, of the 35 South Dakota Constitution: and

36 (5) A legislative commemoration expresses recognition of service or achievements of national 37 or statewide importance or expresses sorrow over death or loss. 38

Amend Chapter 7 of the joint rules as follows:

39 7-12. Joint committees on appropriations. The Joint Committee on Appropriations, 40 consisting of the Senate and House Committees on Appropriations, is deemed to be a standing 41 committee of the Senate and House of Representatives for the limited purposes of hearing agency 42 or other budget presentations, and introducing, hearing, or acting on: bills that authorize the sale 43 of state property, appropriate money, or adjust school district property tax levies pursuant to an 44 appropriations bill. All Joint Committee on Appropriations action shall be approved by a majority 45 vote of the Joint Committee unless a member calls for a separate vote of the House Committee on 46 Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Appropriations in which case a majority vote of each 47 committee is required to adopt the action.

48 Each agenda for the Joint Committee on Appropriations shall be electronically approved by the 49 chair of the Senate Committee on Appropriations and the chair of the House Committee on 50 Appropriations. The respective vice chair of each committee may electronically approve the agenda 51 in the absence of the chair.

- 53 12 Bills authorizing the sale of state property;

1 2 3 4 5	<b>7-12.1 Joint committee on appropriations action.</b> All Joint Committee on Appropriations action shall be approved by a majority vote of the Joint Committee unless a member calls for a separate vote of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Appropriations in which case a majority vote of each committee is required to adopt the action. This rule only applies to action taken by the Joint Committee on Appropriations as a whole.
6 7 8 9	<b>7-12.2 Joint committee on appropriations agenda.</b> Each agenda for the Joint Committee on Appropriations shall be electronically approved by the chair of the Senate Committee on Appropriations and the chair of the House Committee on Appropriations. The respective vice chair of each committee may electronically approve the agenda in the absence of the chair.
