(c) The patient has a reasonable expectation that the practitioner providing the written certification

will continue to provide follow-up care to the patient to monitor the medical use of

cannabis; and

(d) The relationship is not for the sole purpose of providing a written certification for the

medical use of cannabis unless the patient has been referred by a practitioner providing care for the debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the

medical use of cannabis.
