



Annual Unduplicated Headcount






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
On-campus Population with LATC Campus Plan 20 consecutive years of growth!

Fall Enrollment





Campus Needs

Growth Summary

Key Findings

A. General

- Enrollment has grown at an average rate of 5.6% per year from 2006 to present. The fall of 2015 marked 12 consecutive years of enrollment growth for Lake Area Technical Institute. Due to the increasing number of students, the school began a four-phase campus expansion project in the fall of 2008. The project included a new Diesel, Energy, and Welding facility, a new Automotive facility, a centralized Student Center, and a new Agriculture facility. The school has developed new programs including High Performance Engine Machining and Heavy Equipment Operator including a new Law Enforcement program which began Fall 2014.
- The LATI administration aspires future growth to be at 3000 students by 2025, provided space is available.
- LATI programs have evolved continuously to meet changing workforce needs. Facilities meet education requirements and are expected to continue to increase at a rate at least consistent with enrollment growth. High workforce demand facilities must meet workforce education.
- Space needs vary widely by program. For example, Diesel Tech requires approximately 450 s.f./student compared to Human Services Technology at 35 s.f./student.
- Space configuration needs are in many cases program specific (i.e. Auto, Diesel, and Welding) minimizing the potential for sharing or easy
- The current campus and facilities are insufficient to meet future



The Overall Plan: Construction and Renovation costs (including Equipment, Fixtures, and Furnishings)


Total Campus Plan Facility Project costs: \$40M (2020 dollars)

- Archway Complex
 - -Business & General Education: \$10.5M (In design/engineering)
 - -Advanced Manufacturing Lab: \$4.5M (In design/engineering)
- Custom Paint & Fab / High Performance Engine Facility
- Aviation Facility: **\$4.7M**

- \$15.5M project: Industry/Private sector and Public sector
- Builds lab space, classrooms and offices,
- Design and Engineering almost complete
- Provide initial Equipment, Furnishing, and Fixtures
- Return on investment of: yields 84% return in new business output for SD
- Provides capacity for 250 more students.
 - No fee increases needed to cover operations of the new facilities.
 - 250 students will spend over \$400K monthly on the economy
 - 100 graduates earning avg \$40K is \$4M in additional earnings annually or \$220M cumulative in just ten
 years
- Enables increased enrollment across all degrees because all students must take up to 20% general education courses
- Provides needed lab space for advanced manufacturing, business and all technical education degrees. These are some of the highest workforce areas of need in SD. In fact, SD could quadruple capacity at all for technical colleges and not meet today's demand in SD.
- LATC will fund balance between one-time-funding and final costs with Private dollars



Long-term impact for SD economy and workfore AREA

- South Dakota lacks skilled technical employees and the need for two-year college graduates will double in the next 10 years. SD's four Techs could quadruple capacity and not meet SD's demand for nurses, precision machinists, welders, diesel mechanics, and manufacturing techs, to name a few in the highest demand careers. This is an economic driver for South Dakota!
- We estimate the plan would add 800 students, thus placing 500 more skilled graduates into SD's workforce pipeline annually. The life of the facility, that's 25000 more graduates. Since 85%+ of tech college graduates stay in SD, nearly 21250 will live and work here, bolstering our economy. Today the average annual salary for new tech graduates in SD is \$41K, that's conservatively \$20M additional earnings annually or \$1B cumulative in 10 years of graduates.
- While in school, these 800 additional students will spend over \$1.2M/month on the economy. Cumulative salaries from ten-years of Graduates is estimated conservatively at \$1B**
- The research and analysis division of the National Community Development Services Inc projects a Return on investment of: \$1 in the Capital Campaign yields 84% return in new business output for SD.
- Funding would enable LATC to "change lives and launch careers" for tens of 1000s more South Dakotans, as we provide the pathway to good careers and lives for SD citizens.
- Funding enables LATC's continued tradition of providing excellence in higher education: being named the 2017 Aspen Prize Winner for Community College Excellence, earning recognition by President Barak Obama at LATC's 2015 Commencement Ceremony, being a national leader in student success rates, and opening campus at full capacity during the pandemic.
