

WUE

- The Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) has saved 567 eligible students on out-of-state tuition this year by paying no more than 150% of in-state tuition at partner institutions across the West.
- SD students have saved \$97 million through WUE since 1989.

 - Casper College (41)



- The Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) saved 56 eligible students on select out-of-state graduate certificate, master's, and doctoral programs this year by paying up to 150% of in-state tuition.
- Most popular out-of-state schools for SD graduate students:

 - U. of Northern Colorado (6)
 - U. of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus (5)

PSEP

- The Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP) allows students pursuing careers in 10 health fields to enroll in participating programs in the WICHE region and receive substantial tuition support from their home state/territory.
- SD doesn't use PSEP because its residents typically enroll in the state's public programs for several PSEP fields or have agreements with neighboring states for programs not offered by their public institutions.
- SD institutions and their local economies can benefit from PSEP. For example, the U. of South Dakota currently enrolls one physical therapy student and one occupational therapy student from other WICHE states. The institution receives support fees paid by the students' home state to reduce their tuition costs.
