House Concurrent Resolution 6004

1A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, urging the creation of safe and supportive2environments for students with epilepsy.

3 WHEREAS, seizures and epilepsy are among the most common neurological problems

4 affecting students; and

5 <u>WHEREAS, estimates indicate there are approximately 470,000 children living with</u>

6 epilepsy in the United States, or approximately six students in a school of 1,000 students;

7 <u>and</u>

8 WHEREAS, students spend a significant portion of their waking hours in school settings,

9 making it critical that school personnel have a fundamental knowledge of what epilepsy is,

10 how seizures can be recognized, and how appropriate first aid can be rendered; and

11 <u>WHEREAS, students with epilepsy may have challenges with learning and school</u> 12 performance, as a result of their seizures and medication; and

13 <u>WHEREAS, students with epilepsy are at increased risk of injuries, suicide, and early</u>
14 <u>death; and</u>

WHEREAS, students with epilepsy may also experience attention deficit disorder, anxiety,
depression, and social problems; and

WHEREAS, epilepsy is not an insurmountable bar to success in an educational setting and,
eventually, a workplace setting;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Ninety-

20 <u>Seventh Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the</u>

21 Legislature urges all schools and school districts in this state to help students with epilepsy

22 on their path to success, by providing a safe and supportive school environment, so that

- 1 <u>students with epilepsy are also able to reach their full academic potential, build meaningful</u>
- 2 <u>friendships and relationships, and lead full and productive lives.</u>
