6 such material or data consists of trade secrets or commercial or financial information regarding the  
7 operation of such business, are not considered public records, and are exempt from disclosure.  
8 Nothing in this section prohibits the disclosure of confidential information to the extent necessary to  
9 collect or recoup the loan or as may be required under applicable federal law."
