House Bill 1061

AMENDMENT 1061H FOR THE HOUSE COMMERCE AND ENERGY ENGROSSED BILL

1 An Act to codify an advisory council for the appraiser certification program.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

3 Section 1. That chapter 36-21B be amended with a NEW SECTION:

- 4 The secretary of the Department of Labor and Regulation shall establish an 5 advisory council for purposes of soliciting input from appraisers, financial institutions, and other experts in the areas of appraiser certification program administration, in order to 6 7 sustain a program that is consistent with applicable federal and state requirements. 8 The advisory council shall consist of eleven members: 9 (1)Director of the Division of Banking; Executive Director of the South Dakota Real Estate Commission; 10 (2) 11 (3) One licensed real estate broker in this state; <u>(</u>4) 12 One financial institution representative; 13 (5) One mortgage broker; and 14 (6) Six licensed or certified appraisers in this state: 15 One state-licensed appraiser located anywhere in the state; (a) 16 Two state-certified residential appraisers, one located in eastern South (b) Dakota and one located in western South Dakota; 17 Two state-certified general appraisers, one located in eastern South Dakota 18 (c) and one located in western South Dakota; and 19 20 (d) One institutional staff appraiser. 21 Section 2. That chapter 36-21B be amended with a NEW SECTION: 22 Each council member shall serve a term of three years, except that three of those
- 23 <u>who are members as licensed or certified appraisers that are initially appointed shall serve</u>
- 24 <u>a term of two years for initial appointments effective July 1, 2022, the real estate broker</u>

1	representative, the state-certified residential appraiser located in eastern South Dakota,
2	and the state-certified general appraiser located in eastern South Dakota shall serve a
3	term of three years; the mortgage broker representative, the state-certified residential
4	appraiser located in western South Dakota, and the state-licensed appraiser shall serve a
5	term of two years; and the financial institution representative, the state-certified general
6	appraiser located in western South Dakota, and the institutional staff appraiser shall serve
7	a one-year term. No council member may be appointed to more than three consecutive,
8	full terms. If a vacancy occurs, the council will recommend to the secretary of the
9	Department of Labor and Regulation a person to fill the unexpired term. The appointment
10	of a person to an unexpired term is not considered a full term. Term limits do not apply
11	to the director of the Banking Division or the Executive Director of the South Dakota Real
12	Estate Commission. These members represent a department staff position.
13	The council shall meet quarterly at such time and place within this state as shall

13The council shall meet quarterly at such time and place within this state as shall14be designated by the secretary of the Department of Labor and Regulation. The council15shall meet the requirements of chapter 1-25 regarding open meetings.

16 Each council member, except the members representing a department staff 17 position, shall receive travel subsistence, and per diem in accordance with rules 18 established by the State Board of Finance. Eligible members must be paid for each day of 19 actual service for traveling to, attending, and returning from meetings of the council. 20 Travel, subsistence, and per diem must be paid on vouchers duly verified and approved 21 according to the rules determined by the State Board of Finance.

22 Section 3. That chapter 36-21B be amended with a NEW SECTION:

To be eligible to serve as a council member, a candidate for the appraiser, real estate broker, or mortgage broker position must hold an applicable license, certificate, or credential in good standing in this state. To be considered in good standing, the candidate must not have been subject to any disciplinary action that affects legal eligibility to engage in appraisal practice, real estate brokerage, or mortgage brokerage for three years after successful completion of any sanctions imposed. Examples of sanctions that affect a licensee's eligibility to practice are suspension, revocation or voluntary surrender.

Section 4. That chapter 36-21B be amended with a NEW SECTION:

31If an appraiser, real estate broker, or mortgage broker member of the council is32subject to any disciplinary action that affects legal eligibility to engage in appraisal

- 1 practice, real estate brokerage, or mortgage brokerage, the council shall recommend that
- 2 <u>the secretary of the Department of Labor and Regulation remove the member.</u>
