Good morning Representative Blare,

It was brought to my attention that you requested analysis regarding the fiscal impact of HB1119. Neither SDHAA nor DOE track the number of alternative instruction students participating in activities. That said, SDHSAA Executive Director Daniel Swartos reached out to school districts. To date, 135 school districts have responded. His approximation is that somewhere between 100-115 alternative instruction students participate in sports-related activities. I took the median of these (107.5), multiplied it by 0.10, and plugged the new projected enrollment number into the state aid to general education formula using 3% inflation. The annual fiscal impact to the state is estimated to be \$71,969. I hope this helps! Should you need any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.
