Additional deletions or amendments to the 13 adopted provisions of the Uniform Plumbing Code may be made by the governing body, and are 14 effective upon their filing with the county auditor."

15 On page 1, after line 13, of the Introduced bill, insert: "

16 Section 2. That § 36-25-16 be AMENDED:

17 **36-25-16.** Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit any municipality by ordinance from making 18 and enforcing requirements and standards regarding plumbing, and from making inspections and 19 collecting fees relating thereto. Any such ordinances shall be deemed the applicable standards as to any plumbing work in such municipality, provided that the standards as contained in such ordinances 20 21 meet the minimum standards of the State Plumbing Code as adopted by the commission and altered 22 as provided for in this section or section 1 of this Act, and that any person registered by the 23 commission may do plumbing work in such municipality for a period of six months following 24 application for a permit or license in said municipality.

The governing body of any local unit of government may delete any portion of the State Plumbing Code before adopting the provisions within. Additional deletions or amendments to the adopted provisions of the State Plumbing Code may be made by the governing body, and are effective upon their filing with the county auditor."
