- 1 An Act to prohibit the use of political litmus tests in education.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
 - Section 1. That chapter 13-49 be amended with a NEW SECTION:
