## 2022 South Dakota Legislature

FISCAL NOTE 2022-FN1257A

HB 1257, An Act to establish a fund to assist counties with paying infrastructure expenditures.

The bill would establish county capital improvement funds to assist counties with meeting expenditures for the purpose of repairing or improving roads, or acquiring, constructing, renovating, or replacing a building or structure described in SDCL 7-25-1 and 7-25-3, or a facility designed to reduce jail incarceration. The Department of Revenue, on a monthly basis, would deposit 5.5% of the revenue collected from sales and use taxes into the counties' capital improvement funds.

For FY2023, the bill would reduce revenues to the State General Fund by an estimated \$69,072,002. The amount of funds available to counties for the purposes stated in the bill would be \$69,072,002. The following table estimates the county distribution pursuant to the bill.
