I write this to show support for the above mentioned bill. I do this for several reasons while at the same time understanding the importance of private landowner rights which is a foundational stone of our society.

Growing up there was a time when respect for those who have passed on was commonplace. Even to the point that out of respect for the deceased we would not walk on their grave site. That respect seems to have long since passed and gotten worse.

My interest in this legislation lies in the fact that at one time a great many interments were in what are now fields and pastures and are duly marked with stones and markers.
