20 The Committee on House State Affairs respectfully reports that it has had under consideration
21 **HB 1196** and returns the same with the recommendation that said bill do pass.

24 **HB 1142, 1150, 1263, 1274, and 1297** which were deferred to the 41st Legislative Day.

26 The Committee on House State Affairs respectfully reports that it has had under consideration
27 **HB 1319** and returns the same with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

28 1319B

29 On page 1, after line 18, of the Introduced bill, insert: "

30 **Section 2. That § 12-27-8 be AMENDED:**

31 **12-27-8.** A legislative or county candidate or the candidate's campaign committee may accept
32 contributions during any calendar year as follows:

33 (1) Not to exceed one thousand dollars from a person, unless the person is the candidate or
34 a member of the candidate's immediate family, in which case contributions may be made without
35 limit;

- 1 (2) Not to exceed one thousand dollars from an entity;
2 (3) Without limit from a political action committee;
3 (4) Without limit from a political party; and
4 (5) Without limit from a candidate campaign committee.

5 Any contribution from a federal candidate campaign committee is prohibited. Any contribution
6 from a ballot question committee is prohibited. Any contribution from a person who is an
7 unemancipated minor shall be deducted from the total contribution permitted under this section by
8 the unemancipated minor's custodial parent or parents. A violation of this section is a Class 2
9 misdemeanor. A subsequent offense within a calendar year is a Class 1 misdemeanor."

10 And that as so amended, said bill do pass.

13 MR. SPEAKER:

14 The Committee on House Judiciary respectfully reports that it has had under consideration
15 **HB 1099** and returns the same with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

16 1099A

17 On page 1, line 17, of the Introduced bill, after "child." delete "Section 2. That § 26-8A-31 be
18 AMENDED:

19 "

20 On page 1, line 18, of the Introduced bill, after "AMENDED:" delete "26-8A-31. At the taking
21 of testimony pursuant to § 26-8A-30, the public shall be excluded from the room in which the
22 witnesschild is testifying. The court shall determine those persons permitted to be physically present
23 shall be determined by the court. The court, in its discretion, may permit in the room a person
24 whose presence would contribute to the well-being of the witnesschild or the reduction of
25 apprehension of the witnesschild during the testimony. Attorneys for the parties may not be
26 excluded.

27 If the court makes a specific finding, outside the presence of the jury, that the presence of the
28 defendant, or in a civil case, the presence of the respondent, in the same room as the witnesschild,
29 will cause substantial emotional distress to the child and that such distress would impair the ability
30 of the witnesschild to communicate, upon such finding the court may exclude the defendant from
31 the room in which the witnesschild is testifying. However, if the defendant is excluded, the testimony
32 of the witnesschild shall be by two-way, closed -circuit television such that the testimony of the
33 witnesschild is televised in the courtroom and simultaneously thereto, a monitor in the room in
34 which the witnesschild is testifying displays a view of the courtroom which view shall include the
35 defendant. The right to have the defendant's image televised in the room in which the witnesschild
36 is testifying is a right of the defendant which the defendant may waive. If the defendant is excluded
37 from the room in which the witnesschild is testifying, the court shall provide for instantaneous
38 communication between the defendant and defense counsel and grant reasonable court recesses
39 during the testimony for consultation between the defendant and defense counsel. The court may
40 communicate by audio system with attorneys outside of the courtroom.

41 If, on the motion of the prosecuting attorney and outside the presence of the jury, the court
42 makes a specific finding that the child will suffer substantial emotional distress that will impair the
43 ability of the child to communicate due to the presence of the jury or, although the child may be
44 able to communicate in front of the jury, the child will suffer more than de minimis emotional distress
45 due to the presence of the jury, the court may exclude the jury from the room in which the child is

1 testifying. The testimony of the child must be televised at the same time to the courtroom by closed
2 circuit television equipment."

3 On page 2, line 23, of the Introduced bill, after "equipment." delete "Section 3. That chapter
4 26-8A be amended with a NEW SECTION:

5 "

6 On page 2, line 24, of the Introduced bill, after "SECTION:" delete "In any proceeding in which
7 a child under the age of eighteen is describing any act of sexual contact or rape performed with or
8 on the child by another, any act of physical abuse or neglect of the child by another, any act of
9 physical abuse or neglect of another child, any act of human trafficking of the child by another, or
10 any act constituting a crime of violence as defined in § 22-1-2 committed against the child or another
11 child, the court on its own motion or by motion of an attorney in the proceeding may provide any
12 of the following accommodations to the child:

13 (1) To be addressed, asked questions, and read the oath or affirmation to testify truthfully in
14 an age-appropriate manner;

15 (2) To be free of nuisance or harassing tactics in the proceeding;

16 (3) To have a person who would contribute to the well-being of the child present, clearly visible,
17 and in close proximity, if the person is not a witness in the proceeding;

18 (4) To have sufficient breaks in the proceedings to allow the comfort of the child;

19 (5) To have a certified therapeutic dog as defined by § 23A-24-10, item used to provide
20 psychological comfort, or both, present in the room with the child;

21 (6) If the testimony is not taking place in a room other than the courtroom, to the use of a
22 screen that would permit the judge, jury, and defendant to see the child but would obscure the
23 child's view of the defendant, the public, or the jury; or

24 (7) If the defendant has chosen to proceed pro se, to have the court appoint standby counsel
25 for the defendant for the sole purpose of questioning the child on behalf of the defendant if the court
26 finds that there is a substantial likelihood that emotional harm would come to the child if the
27 defendant could question the child directly."

28 And that as so amended, said bill do pass.

29 Also MR. SPEAKER:
