# BROADBAND BREAKDOWN

#### **THE PAST**

#### 2019 Legislative Session:

\$5M in state general funds for broadband; all spent in CY 2019

• Leveraged \$6,433,795 in private matching dollars

#### **2020 Legislative Session:**

\$5M in state general funds for broadband; all spent in CY 2020

 Leveraged \$8,684,882 in private matching dollars

**2020:** Governor Noem allocates \$6.6M in federal CARES Act funds for broadband; *all spent in CY 2020* 

• Leveraged \$10,051,013 in private matching dollars

### **2021 Legislative Session:**

\$75M in state general funds for broadband

- \$200,000 set aside for administrative costs
- **GOAL:** Use available federals funds first to return as much of the \$75M to the legislature as possible

**2021:** Governor Noem allocates \$30.5M in available federal CARES Act funds for broadband

Allowed GOED to keep the \$75M untouched

#### THE FUTURE

#### **2022 Legislative Session:**

\$50M in federal ARPA funds requested for broadband (SB 55)

- \$27.5M in grants announced in June 2021—ARPA would cover \$25M of this
  - If SB 55 does not pass, this \$27.5M will come out of the \$75M in state general funds
- Remaining \$25M would be used as matching dollars for Biden infrastructure bill
- With passage of SB 55, the
   \$75M in state general funds
   would remain almost completely
   untouched by unlocking \$100M
   in future federal funds

**2022 (time TBD):** Minimum of \$100M for every state from Biden's infrastructure bill

- Timeline unclear—U.S. Dept. of Commerce has until May 2022 to promulgate rules; money will be disbursed after that
- 25% match from states required—ARPA can be used as matching dollars
