19 On page 4, line 23, of the Introduced bill, delete " title 25" and insert " chapter 25-5A"

20 On page 4, line 24, of the Introduced bill, delete "Upon the birth of a child, the following rights
21 of parentage vest under a gestational surrogacy arrangement pursuant to this chapter:

22 (1) An intended parent is the parent of " and insert

23 On page 4, line 26, of the Introduced bill, delete "the child for purposes of state law;

24 (2) The child is considered the child of the intended parent for purposes of state law;

25 (3) Parental rights vest in the intended parent; and

26 (4) Sole custody, care, and control of the child rest solely with the intended parent.

27 Neither the gestational carrier nor spouse or partner of the gestational carrier, if any, is the
28 parent of the child for purposes of state law unless a genetic test proves the child is the biological
29 child of the gestational carrier." and insert " The provisions of this chapter and chapter 25-6 are the
30 only means by which the relationship between a birth mother and a child may be voluntarily
31 terminated by an order of the court."

32 On page 5, line 1, of the Introduced bill, delete " title 25" and insert " chapter 25-6"

33 On page 5, line 2, of the Introduced bill, delete "A court shall enter an order of parentage if it
34 finds the order is in the best interest of the child, prior to the birth of a child. The orders of parentage
35 immediately vest parental rights and duties in the intended parent. The order must designate the

1 content of the birth record in accordance with section 6 of this Act and direct the South Dakota
2 Department of Health to designate each intended parent as the parent of the child.

3 A judgment establishing the intended parent's exclusive legal parentage may be established
4 before birth. The judgment has the same effect and is subject to the same procedures, defenses,
5 and proceedings as any other civil judgment.

6 The petition to establish parentage must state that the parties entered into a valid gestational
7 carrier agreement and a pregnancy or birth has resulted." and insert " The provisions of this chapter
8 and chapter 25-5A are the only means by which the relationship between a birth mother and a child
9 may be voluntarily terminated by an order of the court."

21 this section, a youth or amateur sport is any sport in which the participants are aged nineteen or
22 younger and do not receive compensation for participation.

23 **Section 2. That chapter 10-46 be amended with a NEW SECTION:**

24 This chapter does not apply to any person coaching a youth or amateur sport whose gross
25 receipts from coaching total less than four thousand dollars in any calendar year. For purposes of
26 this section, a youth or amateur sport is any sport in which the participants are aged nineteen or
27 younger and do not receive compensation for participation."

6 The question being "Shall **HB 1080** pass as amended?"

7 And the roll being called:

8 Yeas 29, Nays 6, Excused 0, Absent 0

11 Otten, Rohl, Rusch, Schoenbeck, V. J. Smith, Steinhauer, Sutton, Symens, Tobin, Wheeler, and

13 Nays: Castleberry, Heinert, Kolbeck, Schoenfish, Stalzer, and Wiik

14 So the bill having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the members-elect, the President
15 declared the bill passed and the title was agreed to.

16 **SIGNING OF BILLS**

17 The President publicly read the title to

18 **HB 1056:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise provisions related to medical cannabis data
19 maintained by the Department of Health.

20 **HB 1069:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to include out-of-state convictions as a basis of an
21 enhanced penalty for certain drug crimes.

22 **HB 1103:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide a reimbursement schedule for
23 chiropractic, dental, and optometric services under the Medicaid program.

24 And signed the same in the presence of the Senate.

25 Sen. Frye-Mueller moved that the Senate do now adjourn, which motion prevailed and at 4:30
26 p.m. the Senate adjourned.
