#### 19 Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

For purposes of this Act, the following federal actions, whether undertaken by statute,
 regulation, executive order, judicial order, or administrative order, constitute federal infringements
 on the people's right to keep and bear arms, as guaranteed by the Second Amendment of the United
 States Constitution:

(1) Any tax, levy, fee, or stamp imposed on firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition, not
 common to other goods and services, and which might reasonably be expected to create a chilling
 effect on the purchase or ownership of firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition by law-abiding
 citizens;

(2) Any registration or tracking of firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition, which might
 reasonably be expected to create a chilling effect on the purchase or ownership of firearms, firearm
 accessories, or ammunition by law-abiding citizens;

31 (3) Any registration or tracking of the owners of firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition,
 32 which might reasonably be expected to create a chilling effect on the purchase or ownership of
 33 firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition by law-abiding citizens;

- 34 (4) Any action forbidding the possession, ownership, use, or transfer of firearms, firearm
   35 accessories, or ammunition by law-abiding citizens; and
- 36 (5) Any action ordering the confiscation of firearms, firearm accessories, or ammunition from
   37 law-abiding citizens.
- 38 Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

- 1 <u>Any federal action described in section 1 of this Act:</u>
- 2 <u>(1) Is invalid in this state;</u>
- 3 (2) May not be recognized in this state;
- 4 (3) Must be specifically rejected by this state; and
- 5 (4) Has no effect in this state.

# 6 Section 3. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

Each court and any law enforcement agency having jurisdiction in this state shall protect the
 right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, within this state, and shall protect these rights
 from any federal action described in section 1 of this Act.

#### 10 Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

11 <u>No state agency, political subdivision, or any elected or appointed official or employee of this</u> 12 <u>state or of a political subdivision, acting under governmental authority, may enforce or attempt to</u> 13 <u>enforce any federal action described in section 1 of this Act.</u>

Nothing in this chapter precludes the acceptance of aid from federal officials for the purpose
 of enforcing the laws of this state.

#### 16 Section 5. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

Any political subdivision or law enforcement agency that employs a law enforcement officer
 who knowingly violates this Act, is liable for any injury caused to a person and is subject to
 imposition, by a court, of a civil penalty in the amount of fifty thousand dollars per violation.

Any political subdivision or law enforcement agency that knowingly employs a person who was
 found to have violated this Act, is subject to a civil penalty in the amount of fifty thousand dollars
 for each person so employed.

23 The court shall forward any civil penalty collected under this section to the state treasurer for 24 deposit in the general fund.

Any person may seek the issuance of a temporary or permanent injunction to restrain and
 prevent a violation of this Act. Any prevailing party, other than a political subdivision, is entitled to
 receive reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

# 28 Section 6. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 23:

29 It is not a violation of this Act for a person to provide material aid to a federal law enforcement 30 officer who is in pursuit of a suspect having a demonstrable criminal nexus with another state or 31 country, provided the suspect is not a resident of this state and not present in this state.

32 It is not a violation of this Act for a person to provide material aid to a federal prosecutor in 33 any felony case involving controlled substances or violence against another person, if the case 34 includes weapons violations of laws that are substantially similar to laws of this state and if the 35 weapons violations are ancillary to the prosecution. "
