- 7 (3) "Manufacturer," a licensed entity that acquires, possesses, manufactures, delivers,
 8 transfers, transports, supplies, or sells marijuana products to a marijuana facility;
- 9 <u>(4) "Marijuana facility," an entity licensed to cultivate, test, manufacture, or dispense</u> 10 <u>marijuana or marijuana products;</u>
- 11 (5) "Marijuana," as defined in § 22-42-1;
- (6) "Marijuana concentrate," the resin extracted from any part of a marijuana plant and every
 compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation from such resin;
- (6) "Marijuana product," any product infused with marijuana concentrate and intended for use
 or consumption by humans."

17 Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 10:

18 There is hereby levied an excise tax on the first sale or transfer of unprocessed marijuana by 19 a marijuana cultivation facility, at a rate of fifteen percent of the average market rate of the 20 unprocessed marijuana if the transaction is between affiliated marijuana business licensees. There 21 is levied a tax on the first sale or transfer of unprocessed marijuana by a marijuana cultivation 22 facility, at a rate of fifteen percent of the contract price for unprocessed marijuana if the transaction 23 is between unaffiliated retail marijuana business licensees. Marijuana excise tax shall also be 24 calculated as fifteen percent of the contract price when the first transfer of marijuana that has been 25 harvested for sale at a retail marijuana store or extraction by a marijuana product manufacturing 26 facility is between unaffiliated retail marijuana cultivation facilities. The tax shall be imposed at the 27 time when the marijuana cultivation facility first sells or transfers unprocessed marijuana from the 28 marijuana cultivation facility to a marijuana product manufacturing facility or a marijuana store. 29 This tax is in lieu of the tax imposed pursuant to § 10-45-2. The Department shall establish, by 30 rules adopted under chapter 1-26, the method for calculating the average market rate."

32 Section 5. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 10:

33 Each manufacturer liable for the payment of taxes levied under this chapter shall file with the 34 secretary of revenue a return, on a form prescribed by the secretary, showing the kind and quantity 35 of marijuana manufactured, received, and in the manufacturer's possession, together with the names of the persons from whom received, the amount of tax due, and any other information 36 37 prescribed by the secretary. The return, covering the period of one calendar month, together with 38 payment of the tax due, must be transmitted to the Department of Revenue on or before the twenty-39 fifth day of the second month following the close of the reporting period. A violation of this section 40 is a Class 1 misdemeanor."

42 Section 6. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 10:

Any manufacturer required to file returns or reports under this chapter, who fails to file a return
 or report or pay the tax when due, is subject to interest and penalty at the rates set forth in § 10 59-6. For reasonable cause shown, the secretary of revenue may reduce or eliminate the penalty.

If any manufacturer files a false or fraudulent return, an amount equal to the tax evaded, or attempted to be evaded, shall be added to the tax. Penalty and interest are considered the same as tax for the purposes of collection and enforcement, including liens, distress warrants, and criminal violations. Any payment received for taxes, penalty, or interest is applied first to tax, beginning with the oldest delinquency, then to interest, and then to penalty. No court may enjoin the collection of the tax or civil penalty."

9 Any manufacturer liable for the payment of the taxes shall keep, in current and available form 10 on the licensed premises, records of all purchases, sales, quantities on hand, and any other 11 information the secretary of revenue may prescribe by rule promulgated pursuant to chapter 1-26. 12 The secretary of revenue may require from a manufacturer any report necessary to administer the 13 requirements of this chapter. The secretary may require the production of any book, record, 14 document, invoice, and voucher kept, maintained, received, or issued by the manufacturer in 15 connection with the manufacturer's business that, in the judgment of the secretary, may be necessary to administer and discharge the secretary's duties, to secure the maximum of revenue to 16 17 be paid, and to carry out the requirements of this chapter. A violation of this section is a Class 1 18 misdemeanor."

20 Section 8. That a NEW SECTION be added to title 10:

25 **22-42-1.** Terms used in this chapter mean:

(1) "Controlled drug or substance," a drug or substance, or an immediate precursor of a drug
or substance, listed in Schedules I through IV. The term includes an altered state of a drug or
substance listed in Schedules I through IV absorbed into the human body;

(2) "Counterfeit substance," a controlled drug or substance which, or the container of labeling of which, without authorization, bears the trade-mark, trade name, or other identifying mark, imprint, number, or device, or any likeness thereof, of a manufacturer, distributor, or dispenser other than the person or persons who manufactured, distributed, or dispensed such substance and which thereby falsely purports or is represented to be the product of, or to have been distributed by, such other manufacturer, distributor, or dispenser;

(3) "Deliver" or "delivery," the actual or constructive transfer of a controlled drug, substance,
 or marijuana whether or not there exists an agency relationship;

(4) "Dispense," to deliver a controlled drug or substance to the ultimate user or human
research subject by or pursuant to the lawful order of a practitioner, including the prescribing,
administering, packaging, labeling, or compounding necessary to prepare the substance for such
delivery, and a dispenser is one who dispenses;

(5) "Distribute," to deliver a controlled drug, substance, or marijuana. Distribution means
 the delivery of a controlled drug, substance, or marijuana;

43 (6) "Equivalent weight" the weight that a given quantity of marijuana products counts against
 44 a quantity of marijuana;

1 (6)(7) "Manufacture," the production, preparation, propagation, compounding, or processing of a controlled drug or substance, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of natural origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis or by a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis. A manufacturer includes any person who packages, repackages, or labels any container of any controlled drug or substance, except practitioners who dispense or compound prescription orders for delivery to deliver to the ultimate user;

7 (7)(8) "Marijuana," all parts of any plant of the genus cannabis, whether growing or not, in its 8 natural and unaltered state, except for drying or curing and crushing or crumbling. The term includes 9 an altered state of marijuana absorbed into the human body. The term does not include fiber 10 produced from the mature stalks of such plant, or oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant. 11 The term does not include the plant Cannabis sativa L. and any part of that plant, including the 12 seeds thereof and all derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers, whether growing or not, with a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than three-13 14 tenths of one percent on a dry weight basis;

(9) "Marijuana concentrate," the resin extracted from any part of a marijuana plant and every
 compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation from such resin;

(10) "Marijuana products," products infused with marijuana concentrate and intended for use or
 consumption by humans;

19 (8)(11) "Practitioner," a doctor of medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, dentistry, optometry, 20 or veterinary medicine licensed to practice his profession, or pharmacists licensed to practice their 21 profession; physician's assistants certified to practice their profession; government employees 22 acting within the scope of their employment; and persons permitted by certificates issued by the 23 Department of Health to distribute, dispense, conduct research with respect to, or administer a 24 substance controlled by chapter 34-20B;

25 (9)(12) "Precursor" or "immediate precursor," a substance which the Department of 26 Health has found to be and by rule designates as being a principal compound commonly used or 27 produced primarily for use, and which is an immediate chemical intermediary used or likely to be 28 used, in the manufacture of a controlled drug or substance, the control of which is necessary to 29 prevent, curtail, or limit such manufacture;

30 (10)(13) "Schedule I," "Schedule II," "Schedule III," and "Schedule IV," those schedules of
 31 drugs, substances, and immediate precursors listed in chapter 34-20B;

32 (11)(14) "Ultimate user," a person who lawfully possesses a controlled drug or substance
 33 for that person's own use or for the use of a member of that person's household or for administration
 34 to an animal owned by that person or by a member of that person's household."

35 On page 1, after line 16, of the Introduced bill, insert: "

36 Section 10. That § 22-42-6 be AMENDED:

37 22-42-6. No person may knowingly possess marijuana. No person under the age of twenty-38 one mya knowingly posess marijuana. It is a Class 1 Class 2 misdemeanor for any person under the 39 age of twenty-one to possess two ounces of marijuana or marijuana in quantities less than four 40 ounces of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products. It is a Class 6 felony for 41 any person under the age of twenty-one to possess four or more ounces of marijuana, including an 42 equivalent weight of marijuana products. It is a Class 2 misdemeanor for any person twenty-one or 43 older to possess more than one ounce but less than four ounces of marijuana, including an 44 equivalent weight of marijuana products. It is a Class 6 felonyClass 1 misdemeanor for any person 45 twenty-one or older to possess more than two ounces of marijuana but less than one half pound 46 four to sixteen ounces of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products. It is a 47 Class 5Class 6 felony for any person twenty-one or older to possess-one-half pound but less than 48 one pound more than sixteen ounces of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana 49 products. It is a Class 4 felony to possess one to ten pounds of marijuana. It is a Class 3 felony to 50 possess more than ten pounds of marijuana. A civil penalty may be imposed, in addition to any

criminal penalty, upon a conviction of a violation of this section not to exceed ten thousand dollars. This section does not apply to any person licensed or registered with the state to undertake an activity involving the possession of marijuana or marijuana products who acts in compliance with the authorizing law."

7 22-42-7. The distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, of less than one-half ounce 8 of marijuana without consideration is a Class 1 misdemeanor; otherwise, the distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, for consideration, of marijuana in quantities one ounce or less 9 10 than four ounces of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products, to any person 11 twenty-one or older is a Class 6 felonyClass 1 misdemeanor. The distribution, or possession with 12 intent to distribute, of more than one ouncefour ounces but less than one half one pound of 13 marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products, to a person twenty-one or older 14 is a Class 5Class 6 felony. The distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, of one-half pound 15 but less than one pound or more of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products, 16 to a person twenty-one or older, is a Class 4 Class 5 felony. The distribution, or possession with 17 intent to distribute, of one pound or more of marijuana is a Class 3 felony. The distribution, or 18 possession with intent to distribute of marijuana, of less than one-half ounce of marijuana, including 19 an equivalent weight of marijuana products, to a minor any person under the age of twenty-one 20 without consideration is a Class 6 felonyClass 1 misdemeanor; otherwise, the distribution, or 21 possession with intent to distribute, of one ounce four ounces or less of marijuana, including an 22 equivalent weight of marijuana products, to a minor any person under the age of twenty-one is a 23 Class 5Class 6 felony. The distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, of more than-one 24 ounce four ounces but less than one half one pound of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of 25 marijuana products, to a minor any person under the age of twenty-one is a Class 4Class 5 felony. 26 The distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, of one-half pound but less than one pound 27 of marijuana to a minor is a Class 3 felony. The distribution, or possession with intent to distribute, 28 of one pound or more of marijuana, including an equivalent weight of marijuana products, to a minor 29 any person under the age of twenty-one is a Class 2 Class 4 felony. A first conviction of a felony 30 under this section shall be punished by a mandatory sentence in the state penitentiary or county 31 jail of at least thirty days, which sentence may not be suspended. A second or subsequent conviction 32 of a felony under this section shall be punished by a mandatory sentence of at least one year. 33 Conviction of a Class 1 misdemeanor under this section shall be punished by a mandatory sentence 34 in county jail of not less than fifteen days, which sentence may not be suspended. A civil penalty, 35 not to exceed ten thousand dollars, may be imposed, in addition to any criminal penalty, upon a 36 conviction of a felony violation of this section. This section does not apply to any person licensed or 37 registered with the state to undertake an activity involving the distribution, or possession with intent 38 to distribute, of marijuana or marijuana products who acts in compliance with the authorizing law."

40 Section 12. That chapter 22-42 be amended with a NEW SECTION:

- 41 <u>The equivalent weight of the following marijuana products to one ounce of marijuana is:</u>
- 42 (1) Eight grams net weight of marijuana concentrate in smokable form;
- 43 (2) Eight grams net weight of vaporizer pens or cartridges;
- 44 (3) Eight hundred milligrams delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol in edibles, excluding oils;
- 45 (4) Five grams net weight of oils in oral dosage syringe or capsule form;
- 46 (5) Twelve fluid ounces of liquid topical application, including ointment, cream, or lotion;
- 47 (6) One ounce of dried topical application, included dried plant material or powder; or
