SECOND READING OF CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS

HB 1282 allow inpatient psychiatric facility placement alternatives for certain patients. (Introduced)

HB 1155 revise the compensation for a township board member overseer. (Introduced)

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

HB 1153 (Removed from Consent Calendar) revise the number of class hours required to obtain a responsible broker's license. (Introduced)

HB 1270 (Removed from Consent Calendar) require a defendant in a criminal proceeding to be physically present during the reading of victim impact statements. (House Judiciary Engrossed)

HB 1272 (Deferred from 23rd LD) revise provisions related to counseling for domestic abuse defendants. (Introduced)

HB 1014 (Deferred from 23rd LD) make an appropriation to fund tax refunds for elderly persons and persons with a disability and to declare an emergency. (Introduced)

HB 1016 (Deferred from 23rd LD) make an appropriation for costs related to disasters in the state and to declare an emergency. (Introduced)

HB 1017 (Deferred from 23rd LD) make an appropriation for costs related to suppression of wildfires in the state and to declare an emergency. (Introduced)

HB 1336 (Deferred from 23rd LD) make various clarifying changes to the state budgeting process. (Introduced)

- HB 1052 place limitations on the enforcement of federal laws and orders related to firearms, accessories, and ammunition. (House Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1335 revise certain provisions regarding the expenditure of moneys allotted to the state by the United States of America. (House Appropriations Engrossed)
- HB 1113 prohibit threats made with the intent to coerce an abortion and to provide a penalty therefor. (Introduced) (PJPCE)
- HB 1116 modify the date for the state's presidential primary elections. (Introduced) (Fiscal Note)
- HB 1308 provide for the payment of signing bonuses to school district staff members. (Introduced)
- HB 1222 provide property tax relief for family day care homes. (Introduced)

- HB 1068 clarify the processing of sexual assault kits performed on individuals ages sixteen and seventeen. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)
