MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

- HCR 6006 To urge the United States Congress and the President of the United States to take no action to employ military forces of the United States in active-duty combat unless the United States Congress has passed an official declaration of war and to bring troops home who are engaged in unconstitutional foreign conflicts. (Introduced)
- HB 1278 (Intent to Reconsider Vote by Which Lost) revise the child support obligation schedule. (Introduced) (Fiscal Note)

- SB 190 revise provisions regarding municipal zoning of medical cannabis establishments. (Introduced)

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1222 (Deferred from 24th LD) provide property tax relief for family day care homes. (Introduced)
- HB 1052 (Deferred from 25th LD) place limitations on the enforcement of federal laws and orders related to firearms, accessories, and ammunition. (House Judiciary Engrossed) (PJPCE)
- HB 1334 (Deferred from 25th LD) make an appropriation of American Rescue Plan Act moneys for certain home and community-based services, and to declare an emergency. (Joint Appropriations Engrossed)
- HB 1045 (Deferred from 25th LD) provide for the use and regulated sale of marijuana, and to impose a tax on the sale of marijuana, and to distribute that revenue to counties. (House Taxation Engrossed) (PJPCE)
- HB 1258 protect an individual's conscience from entities requiring the COVID-19 vaccine. (House State Affairs Engrossed)

- HB 1289 update provisions regarding self-service storage. (House Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1302 modify tuition responsibilities for children in treatment facilities.

- HB 1322 provide for the direct sale of certain home-produced or home-processed foods
and food products. (House Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- HB 1328 require law enforcement to report certain seizures of property.
(House Judiciary Engrossed)
- HJR 5003 proposing and submitting to the voters at the next general election a new
section to Article VI of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, relating
to the definition of a human being. (House State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1021 authorize the Board of Regents to acquire property, contract for the design
and construction of an athletics events center at Dakota State University, to
make an appropriation therefor, and to declare an emergency. (Introduced)
- HB 1022 authorize the Board of Regents to contract for the design and renovation of,
and construction of an addition to, the Stanley J. Marshall Center at South
Dakota State University, to make an appropriation therefor, and to declare an
emergency. (Introduced)
- HB 1023 authorize the Board of Regents to demolish a South Dakota State University
building and to make an appropriation therefor. (Introduced)
- HB 1096 revise provisions regarding livestock identification. (Introduced)
- HB 1208 prohibit chemical abortion drugs and to provide a penalty therefor.
(Introduced) (PJPCE)
- HB 1293 limit liability for certain child welfare agency licensees. (Introduced)
