37 **7-8-12.3.** The board of county commissioners may, within one hundred eighty days of receipt 38 of such written order, redistrict the county's commission districts once to avoid any perceived or 39 potential violation of state or federal law. The commissioners may change the boundaries of the 40 commissioner districts in order that each district<u>shall be_is</u> as regular and compact in form as

practicable and shall redistrict the county so that each commission district contains an appropriate 1 2 number of residents complies with the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, as 3 determined by the last preceding federal decennial census; or the board of county commissioners 4 may, at its discretion that time, choose to have all of its commissioners run elected at large. The 5 board may choose to have its members elected from single-member districts, from multi-member 6 districts, or from a hybrid plan of single- and multi-member districts. Such redistricting shall 7 Redistricting may occur only after giving notice by publication for at least one week in the official 8 newspapers of the county.

9 Section 3. Whereas, this Act is necessary for the support of the state government and its
 10 existing public institutions, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in full
 11 force and effect from and after its passage and approval."
