Report Title: Georgette Cermak Interview

Details:

(ALL TIMES ARE APPROXIMATE)

1. On September 22, 2020, Supervisory Special Agent (SS/A) Arnie Rummel made arrangements to interview Georgette Cermak at the Highmore High School in Highmore, South Dakota.
2. SS/A Rummel arrived and spoke with Georgette Cermak in regard to what Georgette Cermak had observed on September 12, 2020. The following is a synopsis of the interview:
 - A. Georgette Cermak stated on that Saturday night while leaving the area, Georgette Cermak observed a white truck in the ditch. While continuing on, Georgette Cermak observed a part of a deer on the road and due to another car in the other lane, had to drive over the deer part.
 - B. Georgette Cermak observed at that time an individual walking towards Highmore.
 - C. Georgette Cermak saw the back of the individual on the "north side of the road heading into town."
 - D. Georgette Cermak then looked at the clock and saw that it was 10:20 p.m., and thought why would someone be walking on the side of the road at that time.
 - E. Georgette Cermak saw the individual was wearing blue jeans.
 - F. SS/A Rummel asked what part of the road the individual was on and was told that the individual was on the shoulder of the road as the white line was between Georgette Cermak and the individual.
 - G. Georgette Cermak was uncertain of the distance between the white truck and the individual.
 - H. Georgette Cermak made the statement that Georgette Cermak did not have Georgette Cermak's "bright lights on but could still see him over there."
 - I. SS/A Rummel asked if Georgette Cermak had observed any light that the individual would have had. Georgette Cermak replied that it was just a quick glance, but did not see a light.
 - J. Georgette Cermak was unsure of the distance between Georgette Cermak's in-law's turnoff on Highway 14 and the white truck in the ditch.
 - K. Georgette Cermak stated that the area was a dark section of road.

- L. Georgette Cermak did not know who the individual was that was walking.
