## 2023 South Dakota Legislature

## **House Commemoration 8001**

Introduced by: Representative Tordsen

A LEGISLATIVE COMMEMORATION, Honoring E. Royce Williams for his life, 2 achievement, and heroism as he is awarded the Navy Cross.

3 WHEREAS, E. Royce Williams, a native of Wilmot, exemplifying the tenacity, perseverance, 4 and dedication to duty of a South Dakotan, and following the example of his father's military 5 service, was called to serve his country and enlist in the United States Navy after the attack 6 on Pearl Harbor; and 7 WHEREAS, on November 18, 1952, Williams, while serving in Fighter Squadron Seven Hundred Eighty-One (VF-781) on the U.S.S. Oriskany, carried out an early morning bombing 8

9 run on the Hoeryong industrial complex near the Korean-Russian boarder which prompted 10 seven Soviet MiG-15 fighters to launch from a Soviet base near Vladivostok; and

11 WHEREAS, Williams and three other pilots, flying their F9F-5 Panthers as part of the Combat Air Patrol in defense of Carrier Task Force 77, were dispatched in blizzard conditions 12 13 to intercept the seven MiG-15 fighters over the Sea of Japan; and

WHEREAS, Williams and his wingman were left alone to intercept the seven Soviet fighters after the flight-leader had to be escorted back to the U.S.S. Oriskany following equipment concerns with his aircraft; and

17 WHEREAS, Williams, outnumbered by superior aircraft and fighting for his life, was engaged in a thirty-five-minute dogfight with the Soviets, where he expended all of his 18 19 ammunition shooting down four, possibly five, of the seven enemy fighters; and

20 WHEREAS, Williams, suffering from a hit from a thirty-seven millimeter shell that disabled 21 his electrical and hydraulic systems, in addition to two hundred and sixty-three other bullet 22 holes and being forced to dodge a few shots of friendly fire, was miraculously able to land his 23 fighter on the U.S.S. Oriskany; and

- WHEREAS, the United States Navy awarded Williams a Silver Star in April 1953, and after
  deeming the events classified for many years to help prevent further escalation of the war,
  confirmed the unique nature of the heroic act, calling it, "the only direct overwater combat
  between U.S. Navy fighters and Soviet fighters during the Cold War"; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Williams served in the Navy for more than thirty years, flew two hundred and
  6 twenty missions in Korea and Vietnam, was awarded two Distinguished Flying Crosses, the
  7 Medal of Valor, multiple Silver and Bronze Stars, the Legion of Merit with a Combat "V," and
  8 retired in 1984; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Williams, after many years of investigation and evidence gathering, will be 10 presented with the Navy Cross, the United States Navy's second-highest honor, by the 11 Secretary of the Navy, Carlos Del Toro, at a ceremony in San Diego, California, on January 12 20, 2023:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT COMMEMORATED, by the Ninety-Eighth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, that E. Royce Williams, in recognition of a life of achievement, devotion to duty, and heroism, has received the Navy Cross.
