Payment for cognitive based treatment services may be made only 32 if the services are recommended through a risk and needs assessment tool used by the Department 33 of Corrections or the Unified Judicial System. 34 The Department of Social Services shall collect data related to the participation, completion 35

and treatment of Social Services shall collect data related to the participation, completion and treatment outcomes of all probationers and parolees receiving treatment services paid for by the Department of Social Services. The Department of Social Services shall report this information semiannually to the oversight council.
