## **Senate Bill 82**

AMENDMENT 82B
FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

- 1 An Act to modify provisions pertaining to poll watchers.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 Section 1. That § 12-18-9 be AMENDED:

12-18-9. Any person, except a candidate who is on the ballot being voted on at that polling place, may be present at any polling place for the purpose of observing the voting process. Any person may be present to observe the counting process. A candidate who is on the ballot being voted on at a polling place may only be present to cast the candidate's vote during voting hours. A number of poll watchers shall be permitted for each candidate at At a primary election, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1, a number of poll watchers must be permitted for each candidate, or political party and independent candidate at At a general or special election, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1, a number of poll watchers must be permitted for each political party and independent candidate. A number of poll watchers must be permitted from each ballot question committee for an initiated or referred measure or initiated constitutional amendment at any election in which the measure or amendment appears on the ballot, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1. Each polling place shall be arranged in a manner that permits each poll watcher to be positioned in a location where the poll watcher can plainly see and hear what is done within the polling place.

At a general, primary, or special election pursuant to § 12-18-8.1, any candidate, party or ballot question committee as defined in § 12-27-1 is entitled to have a poll watcher present at any polling place for the purpose of observing the voting and counting process. This section may not apply to a candidate who is on the ballot being voted on at a polling place, and the candidate may only be present to cast the candidate's vote during voting hours.

The observation areas may not be less than four feet from, nor more than six feet from, the table at which voters announce their name and address to be issued a ballot at

1 the polling place. The observation areas must be so positioned to permit any poll watcher 2 to plainly see and hear all public aspects of the voting process. 3 A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. 4 Section 2. That § 12-1-3 be AMENDED: 5 12-1-3. Terms used in this title mean: "Ballot question committee," a person or entity that raises, collects, or distributes 6 (1) 7 contributions as one of the following: A proponent for placement on the ballot of one or more initiated or referred 8 measures or initiated constitutional amendments; 9 10 An opponent to placement on the ballot of one or more initiated or referred 11 measures or initiated constitutional amendments; (c) A proponent for the adoption of one or more initiated or referred measures or 12 initiated constitutional amendments on the ballot; 13 14 An opponent to the adoption of one or more initiated or referred measures 15 initiated constitutional amendments on the ballot; (2) "Candidate," a person whose name is on the ballot or who is entitled to be on the 16 ballot to be voted upon for nomination or election at any election; 17 18  $\frac{(2)(3)(2)}{(2)}$  "Election," any election held under the laws of this state; (3)(4)(3) "Election officials," state and local officials charged with the duty of conducting 19 20 elections and the canvass of returns; 21 (4)(5)(4) "Elector," a person qualified to register as a voter, whether or not the person 22 is registered; (5)(6)(5) "Electronic pollbook," an electronic system containing both the registration list 23 24 and pollbook; 25 (6)(7)(6) "General election," the vote required to be taken in each voting precinct of the 26 state on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-27 numbered year;  $\frac{(7)(8)}{(7)}$  "Paid circulator," any person who receives money or anything of value for 28 29 collecting signatures for a petition; 30  $\frac{(8)(9)(8)}{(9)(8)}$  "Party office," an office of a political party organization as distinct from a public 31 office; 32 (9)(10)(9) "Person in charge of an election," or "person charged with the conduct of an 33 election," the county auditor in all cases except local elections for a municipality,

school district, township, or other political subdivision, in which case it is the officer

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1	having the position comparable to the auditor in that unit of government if not
2	specifically designated by law;
3	(10)(11)(10) "Petition," a form prescribed by the State Board of Elections, which
4	contains the question or candidacy being petitioned, the declaration of candidacy
5	if required and the verification of the circulator. If multiple sheets of paper are
6	necessary to obtain the required number of signatures, each sheet shall be self-
7	contained and separately verified by the circulator;
8	(11)(12)(11) "Petition circulator," a resident of the State of South Dakota as defined
9	under § 12-1-4, who is at least eighteen years of age who circulates nominating
10	petitions or other petitions for the purpose of placing candidates or issues on any
11	election ballot;
12	(12)(13)(12) "Political party," beginning with the 2014 general election and each
13	general election thereafter, a party whose candidate for any statewide office
14	received at least two and one-half percent of the total votes cast for that statewide
15	office in either of the two previous general election cycles;
16	(13)(14)(13) "Pollbook" or "poll list," a list containing in numerical order the names
17	of all persons voting at the election and type of ballot voted;
18	(14)(15)(14) "Polling place," a designated place voters may go to vote;
19	(16)(15) "Poll watcher," a person appointed to observe the conduct of an election on
20	behalf of a candidate, a political party, or a ballot question committee;
21	$\frac{(15)(17)(16)}{(17)(16)}$ "Primary" or "primary election," an election held at which candidates are
22	nominated for public office;
23	(16)(18)(17) "Public office," an elected position in government;
24	(17)(19)(18) "Registration list," a list of eligible voters;
25	(18)(20)(19) "Registered mail," does not include certified mail;
26	(19)(21)(20) "Registration officials," the county auditor and deputies and other
27	persons authorized to assist in registration pursuant to chapter 12-4;
28	(20)(22)(21) "Vote center," a polling place when the precinct has been defined as the
29	entire jurisdiction and an electronic pollbook is utilized;
30	(21)(23)(22) "Voter," a person duly registered to vote or one who is performing the
31	act of voting;
32	(22)(24)(23) "Independent (IND)" or "no party affiliation (NPA)," any currently
33	registered voter who writes independent, I, Ind, no party affiliation, no party, no
34	choice, nonpartisan, or line crossed off in the choice of party field on the voter

1	registration form and any individual who is not currently registered to vote who
2	leaves the choice of party field blank on the voter registration form;
3	(23)(25)(24) "Independent candidate," notwithstanding the definition of independent
4	as stated in this chapter, any registered voter regardless of party affiliation who
5	declares to be an independent candidate for public office pursuant to this chapter;
6	(24)(26)(25) "Other," any voter who writes a political party not recognized in South
7	Dakota in the choice of party field on the voter registration form.
