AMENDMENT 1037A FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

An Act to amend the eligibility for admission to the state veterans' home and repeal the residency requirement.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 33A-4-25 be AMENDED:

33A-4-25. Any <u>A</u> veteran, as defined by § 33A-2-1, is eligible for admission to the
state veterans home if the veteran: who has an honorable discharge, who has maintained
a residence in the state at any time in the five years preceding the date of the application,
and who has no income in excess of one thousand dollars per year above the maximum
income limitation for pension benefits as determined by the United States Department of
Veterans Affairs, is eligible for admission to the State Veterans' Home

- 11(1)Is eligible for per diem payment for domiciliary care or nursing home care in a state12veterans home;
- 13(2)Has no adequate means of support, as determined by the United States14Department of Veterans Affairs; or
- (3) Has a rating of total disability as defined by the United States Department of
 Veterans Affairs for pension and compensation purposes.

17 A veteran who was domiciled in the state or in a federally recognized Tribe in this 18 state at any time in the five years preceding the date of application must receive 19 preference for admission. For the purposes of this section, a residence is a physical 20 structure in which a person resides and the term does not include a post office box or 21 address of another mail service purchased by the veteran. A veteran who meets the 22 residence requirements and has a rating of total disability as defined by the United States 23 Department of Veterans Affairs for pension and compensation purposes is also eligible for 24 admission.

25 <u>MembershipResidency</u> status at the State Veterans' Home is not affected because 26 of a medical leave of absence either in a United States Department of Veterans Affairs

- 1 facility or other hospital. Any veteran who is an enrolled member of a federally recognized
- 2 Indian tribe located wholly or partially in the state meets the residency requirement.
