AMENDMENT 1103B FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

- An Act to waive the fee for nondriver identification cards for individuals at or below the federal poverty level.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That chapter 32-12 be amended with a NEW SECTION:

The Department of Public Safety shall waive the fee for an original nondriver identification card or the renewal of a reissued nondriver identification card if the applicant has an annual household income at or below one hundred percent of the federal poverty level. The applicant shall sign and submit evidence an affidavit to the department, with the application, to verify stating that the applicant's income level is at or below one hundred percent of the federal poverty level.

The Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, to establish acceptable forms of evidence to verify income eligibility prescribe the form of the affidavit under this section.

Section 2. That § 32-12-17.2 be AMENDED:

32-12-17.2. The Department of Public Safety may issue upon application a nondriver identification card, similar in form but distinguishable in color from <u>a_driver licenses_license</u>, to any resident of-South Dakota this state. Each applicant for a nondriver identification card shall, as part of the application, present to the department a certified copy of a certificate of birth or another form of evidence of date of birth and identity as allowed by § 32-12-3.1. The Except as provided in section 1 of this Act, the fee for an original or reissued nondriver identification card is the same as prescribed for an original driver license in § 32-12-16. Each nondriver identification card expires on the holder's birthday in the fifth year following the issuance of the nondriver identification card, or on the date of expiration of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States as determined by the systematic alien verification for entitlements system or alternate method approved

by the United States Department of Homeland Security or, if there is no expiration date, for a period no longer than one year from date of issuance, whichever occurs first. Each nondriver identification card is renewable one hundred eighty days before its expiration upon application and payment of the required fee. The fee for the renewal of a nondriver identification card is the same as prescribed for a driver license in § 32-12-16. Any nondriver identification card renewed before its expiration expires five years after the holder's ensuing birthday, or on the date of expiration of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States as determined by the systematic alien verification for entitlements system or alternate method approved by the United States Department of Homeland Security or, if there is no expiration date, for a period no longer than one year from date of issuance, whichever occurs first. The nondriver identification card shall bear an indication if the holder has a living will pursuant to chapter 34-12D or a durable power of attorney for health care pursuant to chapter 59-7 and an indication if the holder is a veteran pursuant to the provisions of § 32-12-17.15. Any nondriver identification card renewed during the thirty-day period following the date of expiration expires five years from the holder's previous birthday, or on the date of expiration of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States as determined by the systematic alien verification for entitlements system or alternate method approved by the United States Department of Homeland Security or, if there is no expiration date, for a period no longer than one year from date of issuance, whichever occurs first.
