11 On the Senate State Affairs Engrossed bill, delete everything after the enacting clause and
 12 insert:

13 "

14 **Section 1. That § 15-6-24(c) be AMENDED:**

15 **15-6-24(c).** A person desiring to intervene shall serve a motion to intervene upon the parties
 16 as provided in § 15-6-5. The motion shall state the grounds therefor and shall be accompanied by
 17 a pleading setting forth the claim or defense for which intervention is sought. The same procedure
 18 shall be followed when a statute gives a right to intervene.

19 When the constitutionality of an act of the Legislature affecting the public interest is drawn in
 20 question in any action to which the state or an officer, agency, or employee of the state is not a
 21 party, the party asserting the unconstitutionality of the act shall notify the attorney general thereof
 22 within such time as to afford ~~him~~ the attorney general the opportunity to intervene.

23 When the constitutionality of a statute in title 12, or the construction or validity of a statute in
 24 title 12 is drawn in question in any action to which the Legislature is not a party, the party asserting
 25 the constitutionality or construction of a statute in title 12 shall serve notice upon the director of the
 26 Legislative Research Council, who shall notify the Executive Board of the Legislative Research
 27 Council thereof within such time as to afford the Executive Board the opportunity to intervene
 28 pursuant to section 2 of this act.

29 **Section 2. That chapter 12-1 be amended with a NEW SECTION:**

30 The Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council has the unconditional right to intervene
 31 when the constitutionality of a statute in title 12, or the construction or validity of a statute in title
 32 12, is drawn in question in any action to which the Legislature is not a party. The intervention is in
 33 the name of the Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council on behalf of the Legislature.
 34 Nothing in this section constitutes an expressed waiver of legislative immunity or legislative privilege
 35 of any member, officer, or staff of the Legislature.

36 **Section 3. That chapter 12-1 be amended with a NEW SECTION:**

37 If the Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council on behalf of the Legislature
 38 intervenes in an action described in section 2 of this Act and finds that the attorney general cannot
 39 adequately represent the interests of the Board, then, notwithstanding § 1-11-5, the Board may
 40 obtain legal counsel other than the attorney general, with the cost of representation paid from funds
 41 appropriated for this purpose, to represent the Board.

29 **HB 1063:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require the Unified Judicial System to assemble
30 a task force to address barriers to services for emerging adults involved in the justice system in
31 South Dakota.

32 **HB 1071:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to establish use of force course standards.
