The statement shall be prescribed by the State Board of Elections

If a person does not have a valid South Dakota driver license, a South Dakota nondriver identification number, or a social security number, the person may only register at the county auditor's office. The applicant shall provide documentation establishing the applicant's residence for
 the thirty days immediately prior to the date of application and shall sign a statement verifying the
 fact that the person does not have a valid South Dakota driver license, a South Dakota nondriver
 identification number, or a social security number.
