AMENDMENT 1070A FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

1An Act to create the Center for American Exceptionalism at Black Hills State2University, make an appropriation therefor, and declare an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That chapter 13-59 be amended with a NEW SECTION:

- 5The Board of Regents shall establish the Center for American Exceptionalism at6Black Hills State University. The center shall make the state's public universities7contributing, meaningful, and relevant partners in civics and social studies education by:
- 8 (1) Working to develop in conjunction with classroom teachers who, by training and
 9 experience, are familiar with civics and social studies curricular development, to
 10 create, distribute, and annually update a K-12kindergarten through grade twelve
- 11 <u>curriculum that:</u>

- (a) Is available to all public schools in school districts;
- 13 (b) Pertains to American history and exceptionalism, explaining;
- (c) Explains why America rose to greatness and how to keep it that way, and
 teaching; and
- 16(d) Teachesstudents to balance critical thinking with love of country. The17curriculum shall include; and
- 18 (e) Includes a South Dakota history and American Indian tribes component
 19 focusing that focuses on the proud history of the indigenous peoples of
 20 South Dakotathis state;
- 21 (2) Providing multi-media content, speaking directly to state social studies standards;
 22 and
- (3) Working with K-12 teachers, including providing Developing and offering to
 elementary and high school teachers professional development workshops
 opportunities, to help students:

1		(a) Understand American history, government institutions,
2		constitutional rights, and cultural contexts in South Dakotathis state
3		and beyond;
4		(b) Develop personal agency and confidence to participate in the civic
5		life of the state and nation through voting, volunteerism, informed
6		discourse, and lifelong involvement; and
7		(c) Appreciate civil discourse, free speech, and engagement with people
8		of all perspectives;
9	<u>(4)</u>	Oversee the We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution Program, as
10		developed by the Center for Civic Education, and its promotion and implementation
11		throughout public schools Promote existing programs and develop and implement
12		new programs to help students, throughout this state, become actively engaged
13		citizens; and
14	<u>(5)</u>	Develop, implement, and annually update a curriculum, that is available to be
15		taught in two courses, at the state's public colleges and universities, and which
16		consists of:
17		(a) A course comparing communist and socialist countries to Western-style
18		democratic countries throughout history; and
19		(b) A course comparing command-style socialist economies to free-market
20		capitalist economies throughout history.
21	Section	2. That chapter 13-59 be amended with a NEW SECTION:
22		A nonprofit board of directors An advisory board, appointed by the president of
23	Black Hills State University, shall govern-provide recommendations and direction to the	
24	<u>Cente</u>	r for American Exceptionalism and may seek all available sources of funding.
25		On or before February first of each year, and at other times as it may deem in the
26	public	interest, the Center for American Exceptionalism shall report, to legislative
27	<u>comm</u>	nittees with having jurisdiction over education, with respect to its operations in the
28	previo	bus fiscal year.
29	Section	3. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$150,000 to the
30	Board of Regents for the purpose of establishing the Center for American Exceptionalism	
31	<u>establish</u>	ed , as set forth in this Act.
32	Section	4. The executive director of the Board of Regents shall approve vouchers and the
22	state aud	itor shall draw warrants to nav expenditures authorized by this Act

33 state auditor shall draw warrants to pay expenditures authorized by this Act.

- 1 Section 5. Any amounts appropriated in this Act not lawfully expended or obligated shall
- 2 <u>revert in accordance with the procedures prescribed in chapter 4-8.</u>
- 3 Section 6. Whereas, this Act is necessary for the support of the state government and its
- 4 existing public institutions, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in
- 5 <u>full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.</u>
