3 **SB 73:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to exclude township-owned self-propelled machinery,  
4 equipment, and vehicles from fuel excise tax.

5 **SB 85:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise rebating provisions in the insurance code.

6 And signed the same in the presence of the House.

7 Rep. Drury moved that the House do now adjourn, which motion prevailed and at 3:35 p.m.  
8 the House adjourned.
