22 On page 1, line 1, of the Senate Education Engrossed bill, delete "require law enforcement
23 notice to school officials when a student is suspected of violating state drug or alcohol laws or of
24 threatening violence" and insert " prohibit the issuance of a written certification to a pregnant woman
25 or breastfeeding mother for purposes of medical cannabis use"

26 On the Senate Education Engrossed bill, delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

27 "

28 **Section 1. That § 34-20G-1 be AMENDED:**29 **34-20G-1.** Terms used in this chapter mean:

30 (1) "Allowable amount of cannabis,":

31 (a) Three ounces of cannabis or less;

32 (b) The quantity of cannabis products as established by rules promulgated by the
33 department under § 34-20G-72;

-
- 1 (c) If the cardholder has a registry identification card allowing cultivation, two flowering
2 cannabis plants and two cannabis plants that are not flowering; and
- 3 (d) If the cardholder has a registry identification card allowing cultivation, the amount
4 of cannabis and cannabis products that were produced from the cardholder's allowable plants, if the
5 cannabis and cannabis products are possessed at the same property where the plants were
6 cultivated;
- 7 (2) "Bona fide practitioner-patient relationship," a treatment or consulting relationship
8 between a practitioner and patient, during which:
- 9 (a) The practitioner completes, at the initial visit, an assessment of the patient's medical
10 history and current medical condition, including an appropriate in-person physical examination;
- 11 (b) The patient is under the practitioner's care for the debilitating medical condition that
12 qualifies the patient for the medical use of cannabis or has been referred by the practitioner caring
13 for the patient's debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of
14 cannabis to another practitioner;
- 15 (c) The patient has a reasonable expectation that the practitioner providing the written
16 certification will continue to provide follow-up care to the patient to monitor the medical use of
17 cannabis; and
- 18 (d) The relationship is not for the sole purpose of providing a written certification for
19 the medical use of cannabis unless the patient has been referred by a practitioner providing care for
20 the debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of cannabis;
- 21 (3) "Cannabis products," any concentrated cannabis, cannabis extracts, and products
22 that are infused with cannabis or an extract thereof, and are intended for use or consumption by
23 humans. The term includes edible cannabis products, beverages, topical products, ointments, oils,
24 and tinctures;
- 25 (4) "Cannabis product manufacturing facility," an entity registered with the department
26 pursuant to this chapter that acquires, possesses, manufactures, delivers, transfers, transports,
27 supplies, or sells cannabis products to a medical cannabis dispensary;
- 28 (5) "Cannabis testing facility" or "testing facility," an independent entity registered with
29 the department pursuant to this chapter to analyze the safety and potency of cannabis;
- 30 (6) "Cardholder," a qualifying patient or a designated caregiver who has been issued
31 and possesses a valid registry identification card;
- 32 (7) "Cultivation facility," an entity registered with the department pursuant to this
33 chapter that acquires, possesses, cultivates, delivers, transfers, transports, supplies, or sells
34 cannabis and related supplies to a medical cannabis establishment;
- 35 (8) "Debilitating medical condition,":
- 36 (a) A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition or its treatment that produces
37 one or more of the following: cachexia or wasting syndrome; severe, debilitating pain; severe
38 nausea, except nausea associated with pregnancy; seizures; or severe and persistent muscle
39 spasms, including those characteristic of multiple sclerosis; or
- 40 (b) Any other medical condition or its treatment added by the department, as provided
41 for in § 34-20G-26;
- 42 (9) "Department," the Department of Health;
- 43 (10) "Designated caregiver," an individual who:

-
- 1 (a) Is at least twenty-one years of age;
- 2 (b) Has agreed to assist with a qualifying patient's medical use of cannabis;
- 3 (c) Has not been convicted of a disqualifying felony offense; and
- 4 (d) Assists no more than five qualifying patients with the medical use of cannabis, unless
5 the designated caregiver's qualifying patients each reside in or are admitted to a health care facility,
6 as defined in § 34-12-1.1, an accredited prevention or treatment facility, as defined in § 34-20A-2,
7 a mental health center, as defined in § 27A-1-1, a child welfare agency, as defined in § 26-6-1, or
8 a community support provider or community services provider, as defined in § 27B-1-17, where the
9 designated caregiver is employed;
- 10 (11) "Disqualifying felony offense," a violent crime that was classified as a felony in the
11 jurisdiction where the person was convicted;
- 12 (12) "Edible cannabis products," any product that:
- 13 (a) Contains or is infused with cannabis or an extract thereof;
- 14 (b) Is intended for human consumption by oral ingestion; and
- 15 (c) Is presented in the form of foodstuffs, beverages, extracts, oils, tinctures, or other
16 similar products;
- 17 (13) "Enclosed, locked facility," any closet, room, greenhouse, building, or other enclosed
18 area that is equipped with locks or other security devices that permit access only by a cardholder
19 or a person allowed to cultivate the plants. Two or more cardholders who reside in the same dwelling
20 may share one enclosed, locked facility for cultivation;
- 21 (14) "Flowering cannabis plant," the reproductive state of the cannabis plant in which the
22 plant shows physical signs of flower budding out of the nodes of the stem;
- 23 (15) "Medical cannabis" or "cannabis," marijuana as defined in § 22-42-1;
- 24 (16) "Medical cannabis dispensary" or "dispensary," an entity registered with the
25 department pursuant to this chapter that acquires, possesses, stores, delivers, transfers, transports,
26 sells, supplies, or dispenses cannabis, cannabis products, paraphernalia, or related supplies and
27 educational materials to cardholders;
- 28 (17) "Medical cannabis establishment," a cultivation facility, a cannabis testing facility, a
29 cannabis product manufacturing facility, or a dispensary;
- 30 (18) "Medical cannabis establishment agent," an owner, officer, board member,
31 employee, or volunteer at a medical cannabis establishment;
- 32 (19) "Medical use," includes the acquisition, administration, cultivation, manufacture,
33 delivery, harvest, possession, preparation, transfer, transportation, or use of cannabis or
34 paraphernalia relating to the administration of cannabis to treat or alleviate a registered qualifying
35 patient's debilitating medical condition or symptom associated with the patient's debilitating medical
36 condition. The term does not include:
- 37 (a) The cultivation of cannabis by a nonresident cardholder;
- 38 (b) The cultivation of cannabis by a cardholder who is not designated as being allowed
39 to cultivate on the cardholder's registry identification card; or
- 40 (c) The extraction of resin from cannabis by solvent extraction unless the extraction is
41 done by a cannabis product manufacturing facility;

- 1 (20) "Nonresident cardholder," a person who:
- 2 (a) Has been diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition, or is the parent, guardian,
3 conservator, or other person with authority to consent to the medical treatment of a person who
4 has been diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition;
- 5 (b) Is not a resident of this state or who has been a resident of this state for fewer than
6 forty-five days;
- 7 (c) Was issued a currently valid registry identification card or its equivalent by another
8 state, district, territory, commonwealth, insular possession of the United States, or country
9 recognized by the United States that allows the person to use cannabis for medical purposes in the
10 jurisdiction of issuance; and
- 11 (d) Has submitted any documentation required by the department, and has received
12 confirmation of registration;
- 13 (21) "Practitioner," a physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered
14 nurse, who is licensed with authority to prescribe drugs to humans. In relation to a nonresident
15 cardholder, the term means a person who is licensed with authority to prescribe drugs to humans
16 in the state of the patient's residence;
- 17 (22) "Qualifying patient," a person who has been diagnosed by a practitioner as having
18 a debilitating medical condition;
- 19 (23) "Registry identification card," a document issued by the department that identifies
20 a person as a registered qualifying patient or registered designated caregiver, or documentation
21 that is deemed a registry identification card pursuant to §§ 34-20G-29 to 34-20G-42, inclusive;
- 22 (24) "Safety-sensitive job," any position with tasks or duties that an employer reasonably
23 believes could:
- 24 (a) Cause the illness, injury, or death of an individual; or
- 25 (b) Result in serious property damage;
- 26 (25) "Under the influence of cannabis," any abnormal mental or physical condition that
27 tends to deprive a person of clearness of intellect and control that the person would otherwise
28 possess, as the result of consuming any degree of cannabis or cannabis products; and
- 29 (26) "Written certification," a document dated and signed by a practitioner:
- 30 (a) Stating that the patient has a qualifying debilitating medical condition or symptom
31 associated with the debilitating medical condition;
- 32 (b) Affirming that the document is made in the course of a bona fide practitioner-patient
33 relationship;
- 34 (c) Specifying the qualifying patient's debilitating medical condition; and
- 35 (d) Specifying the expiration date of the qualifying patient's written certification,
36 pursuant to § 34-20G-43.

37 **Section 2. That chapter 34-20G be amended with a NEW SECTION:**

38 Nothing in this chapter authorizes a practitioner to provide a written certification to a patient
39 who is pregnant or breastfeeding."

40 And that as so amended, **SB 3** do pass.

20 office that is on the ballot being audited.

21 The State Board of Elections shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, prescribing the
22 oath that each member of a county auditing board must take prior to discharging any duties."

24 Board of Elections shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, administering the

3 upon the number of votes cast. If there is only one statewide contest on the ballot, the county
4 auditor shall select the contest with the closest margin based on the number of votes cast as the
5 second contest to be audited. If there are not statewide contests on the ballot, the auditor shall
6 select the two contests on the ballot with the closest margin based on the number of votes cast. If
7 there is only one contest on the ballot, that contest must be audited." and insert " The county auditor
8 shall select the contests for the audit at random without the use of a computer in public during the
9 meeting of the county canvassing board. One contest randomly selected for the audit must be a
10 statewide contest. If there are no statewide contests on the ballot, the auditor randomly shall select
11 another contest on the ballot. If there is only one contest on the ballot, that contest must be
12 audited."

14 of the public shall keep a reasonable distance so as to not interfere with the audit process."
