3 WHEREAS, "Big" Tom Olson was a well-liked and cherished figure in Pierre and specifically
4 at the state capitol. Tom opened multiple restaurants in Pierre, where he was admired for his
5 big heart and bigger personality, earning the respect and friendship of many in the
6 community; and

WHEREAS, Tom was born on August 23, 1949, in Montevideo, Minnesota. Tom and his family moved to Aberdeen, where he graduated from Aberdeen Central High School.
