## **AMENDMENT 105B** FOR THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS ENGROSSED BILL

- An Act to require updated cost report information revise provisions related to the 2 review of reimbursement rates for certain community-based health and human services providers.

## Section 1. That § 28-22-1 be AMENDED:

28-22-1. The Department of Social Services and the Department of Human Services shall jointly, as applicable, establish a rate-setting methodology for services delivered by community-based health and human services providers listed in § 28-22-6. Each category of service shall undergo a comprehensive rate modeling analysis at least every five years. Any rate models determined by the comprehensive rate model analysis must be reviewed and reported annually to include cost report information, rate model components utilizing the most relevant inflation factor respective of the analysis, and other market factors as warranted pursuant to §§ 28-22-2 and 28-22-3. In each intervening year, the department shall review the reimbursement rates for each provider service category using the established rate model to determine whether the allowable costs for each category accurately reflect the provider's current costs as reported to the department in the provider's annual cost report. The department shall report its findings from the annual reimbursement rate review in the annual report required by § 28-22-5. The report must include the costs considered and the calculations used by the department in reaching its findings. The report must also show any year-over-year difference between the thenauthorized reimbursement rate for each provider service category and the reimbursement rate necessary to cover the current costs for that category based on the information contained in the providers' annual cost reports. The departments may elect to conduct the comprehensive rate modeling analysis earlier or on a more frequent basis than every five years if warranted by cost report information or other market conditions. Any new service model shall undergo comprehensive rate modeling analysis prior to implementation.
