2 3 4	The Senate proceeded to the reconsideration of SB 108 , pursuant to the veto of the Governor and the veto message found on page 473 on the Senate Journal as provided in Article IV, Section 4, of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota.
5	The question being "Shall SB 108 pass, the veto of the Governor notwithstanding?"
